They have been talking to Dave Richard and want to prepare for the long legislative session starting in January 2021. They would like to see a study done like the one proposed in HB 488 which didn't pass. They would like all those interested in the DSP issue to join forces instead of smaller splinter groups trying to tackle it alone.

3. Division Updates

Kody Kinsley, Deputy Director of Behavioral Health & IDD NCDHHS

Discussion

Deputy Secretary Kinsley provided an update from the Division:

- Team continues to work hard for North Carolina while waiting on the rest of the results from election
- Policy issues can continue to work on: Innovation Waiver slots, TBI Funding Supports, Medicaid Expansion
- COVID: Increase level of COVID spread. Testing numbers continue to grow, 650 testing events across the state. Reiterated 3 W's: Wear a Cloth Face Covering, Wash Your Hands, and Wait at least 6' apart. Science is clear: if we all wore the mask, we would drive this virus to the ground. Asymptomatic spreaders can slow the spread by wearing their mask. Continuing to work on options to slow the spread. Guidance forthcoming on gatherings for Thanksgiving.

Open for questions:

Mark Fuhrmann: Anything new we need to know on Standard or Tailored Plan? I know we are in the silent period for the Tailored Plan.

DSK: Continuing the plan for Tailored Plan RFA. We can't answer questions. No new work or new efforts. LME/MCOs will have some time to apply. Standard Plan- continue with process of go-live in July 2021. Nothing has really changed. Continuing with enrollment process.

Mark Fuhrmann: Heard from LaToya Chancey on National Core Indicators this morning; anything new on Direct Support Personnel?

DSK: Next opportunity for funding will be at the beginning of next year.

Pat McGinnis: Are there any additional precautions people in areas where large gatherings are happening can take?

DSK: Expressed disappointment in fellow North Carolinians not taking virus seriously enough to protect themselves and others when it comes to wearing masks and following state guidelines on gatherings. We know that large events can become super spreader events. Encourage others to follow the 3 W's; keep distance from those not following the guidance.

Brandon Wilson: Non-profits reached out to him; asked about block grant dollars will be allocated next year. Heard that all MHBG dollars will go to an RFP process? Any indication on that?

DSK: Great question. Yes, over time we'd like to move our block grant dollars to an application process. Make the process competitive; have a lot of organizations that reach out frequently that have a lot of innovative and positive impact. Move to a more transparent process, positive impact from investment in people's lives to maximize the value. Over time will be moving more towards an application process and moving towards a...move to more an equitable process.
