



SPOTLIGHT: PANDEMIC-EBT

What is Pandemic-EBT?

- **P-EBT for students (K-12)** – helps families purchase food for children whose access to meals at school has been impacted by COVID-19 because students are learning virtually, outside of brick-and-mortar schools.
- **P-EBT for children under age 6** (launched May 2021) – Expansion of P-EBT to provide benefits to children under 6 years old that are in households receiving FNS benefits.
- **P-EBT for Summer 2021** – USDA approved our plan to issue a single standard benefit amount of \$375 for students and children under the age of 6 for the June through August 2021 summer period. Summer P-EBT benefits were issued July 2021
- FNS team is currently developing a P-EBT plan to issue benefits to students and children under the age of 6 for the 2021-2022 school year.
- **Key partners** include Department of Public Instruction, Division of Child Development and Early Education


Highlights of P-EBT

P-EBT for Students (March 2020 – March 2021):

- ✓ \$624,413,135.68 for school year 2020-2021
- ✓ Total issuance since Summer 2021 – Over \$1.7 billion dollars
- ✓ 1,275,884 children

P-EBT for Children under the age of 6 (October 2020 – March 2021):


- ✓ \$122,656,602
- ✓ 234,000 children

Emergency Operational Cost Grant Timeline



All institutions receiving Emergency Operational Cost Reimbursement must report back to the State agency how the funds were used.

Emergency Operational Cost Grant



- Funds have been distributed to the institutions.
- Fund were obligated as of 9/30/2021.
- The next step is to report on the usage of the funds.



 - Details about reimbursement of March, April, May, and June 2020 expenses.
 - Remaining funds and a plan to spend the funds.
 - Explain how did these funds provide relief from the effects of COVID?

Guidance for Returning the Funds

- If an institution has to return the funds back, please follow the steps below:
 - Write the check to the NC DHHS.
 - Mail the check to:
 - Joseline Kirkendoll
 - 5601 Six Forks Road
 - 1914 Mail Service Center
 - Raleigh, NC 27699-1914
 - Add in the memo line of the check “EOC Funds”
 - SOs must provide a breakdown of the funds.

Note: The SA will send detailed guidance about returning the EOC funds through an email.





| Summary: | (1) This memorandum provides further clarification on questions related to the Child Nutrition Emergency Operational Costs Reimbursement Programs established in Sec. 722 of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (the Act). (2) This memorandum applies to State agencies administering the National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, and Child and Adult Care Food Program. (3) This document details further instructions and administrative procedures for participation in the reimbursement program established in Sec. 722 of the Act, which makes funding available via State agencies to program operators for the purposes of covering emergency operating costs incurred during the public health emergency. |
