The rates shall reflect the factors as set forth in section 9A.3B.(b) in Session Law 2021-180, amended N.C.G.S. 11 12 143B-153(2a). The maximum rate for the purchase of adult day health services under contract shall be set by the local 13 entity or county lead agency for planning and coordination not exceed forty dollars (\$40.00) per day, per client. The 14 rates shall reflect the factors as set forth in section 9A.3B.(b) in Session Law 2021-180, amended N.C.G.S. 143B-15 153(2a). Adult day health services may only be purchased for an individual following a preadmission health 16 assessment as specified in 10A NCAC 06S .0204(c)(2)(A) and a determination that the individual needs one (1) or 17 more services as set forth in 10A NCAC 06S .0402(a). 18 (d) The maximum reimbursement rate for transporting an adult day care client to an adult day care program or adult 19 day health program shall be set by the local entity or county lead agency for planning and coordination not exceed one 20 dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) for a one-way trip.
