- **88 Counties** have more people above the age of 60 than under the age of 18.
- NC ranks 9th in total population nationally, NC also ranks 9th in the population of those age 65 and older
- An estimated **47,600 people** 60 and older migrated to North Carolina from another state.
- By 2031, the number of individuals aged 65 and older is expected to surpass the population under 18 years old.
- » Adults aged 85 and older are projected to experience the fastest growth in the state over the next 20 years.

## Food Insecurity & Malnutrition



In 2020, North Carolina had the 14th-highest rate of older adult food insecurity in the United States; nearly **7.7%** of adults aged 60 and older were food insecure.

The annual costs of disease-associated malnutrition for adults aged 65 and older in North Carolina is \$140,348,592.
