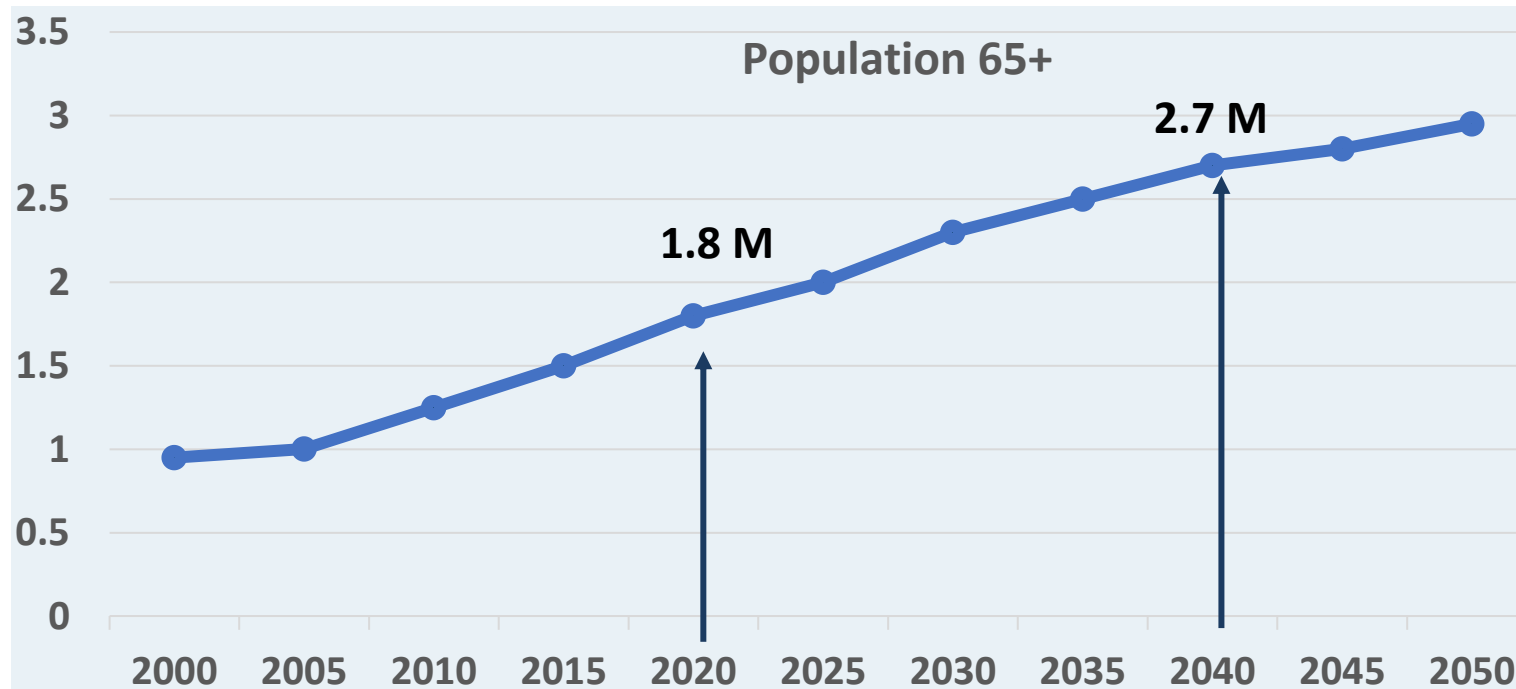

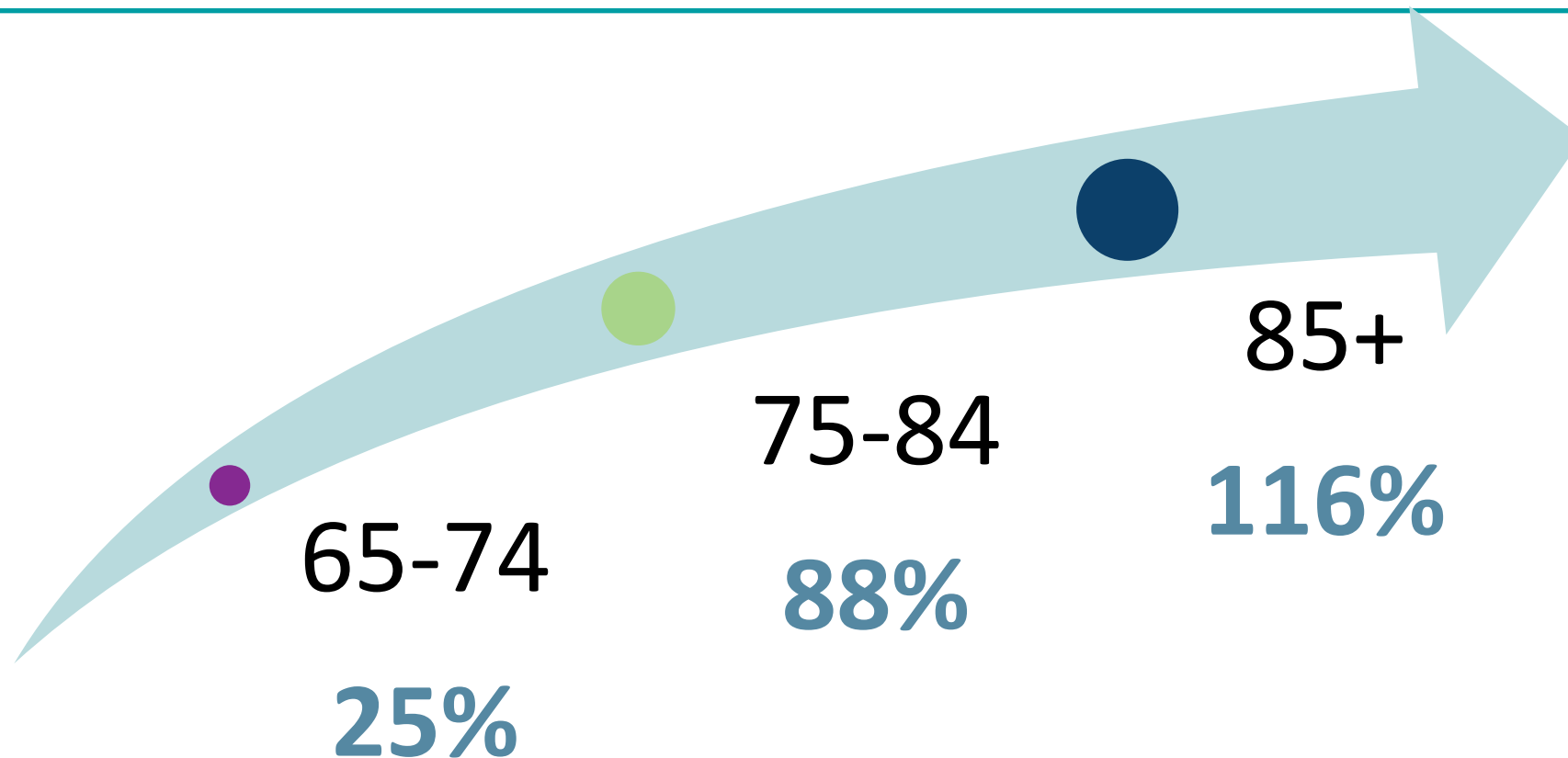

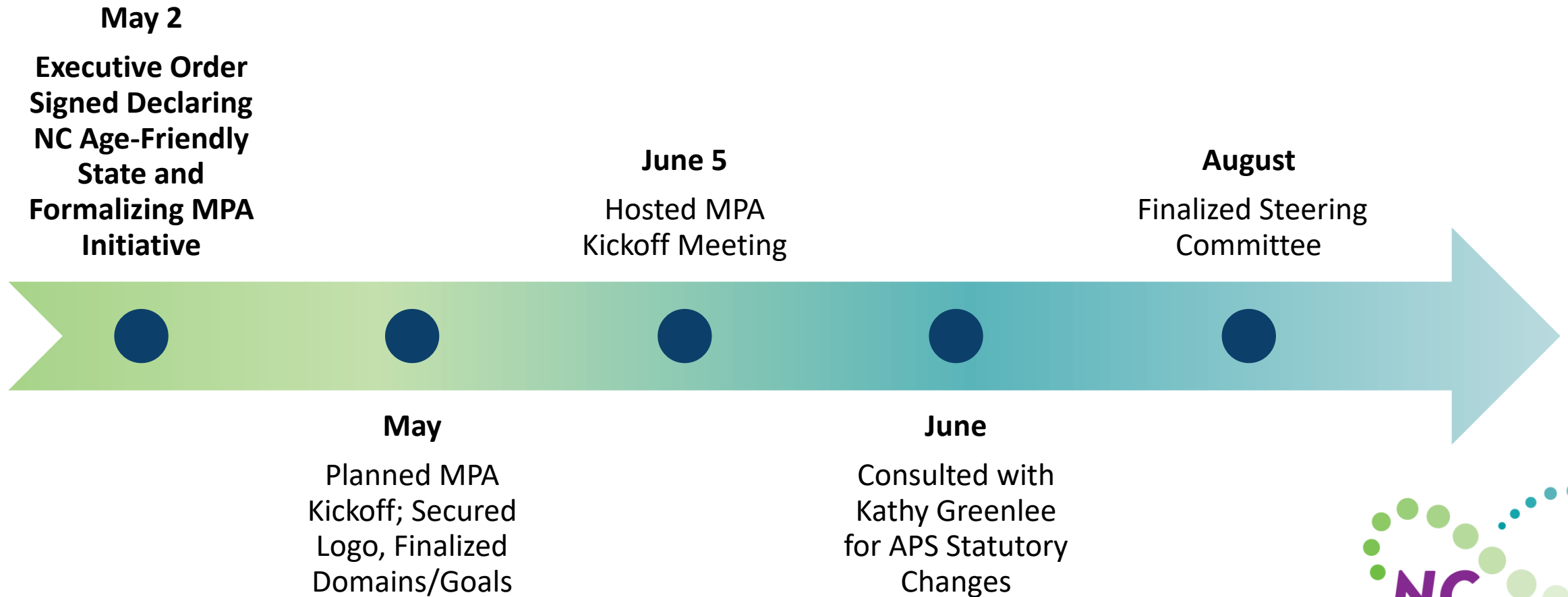
Projected Population Growth

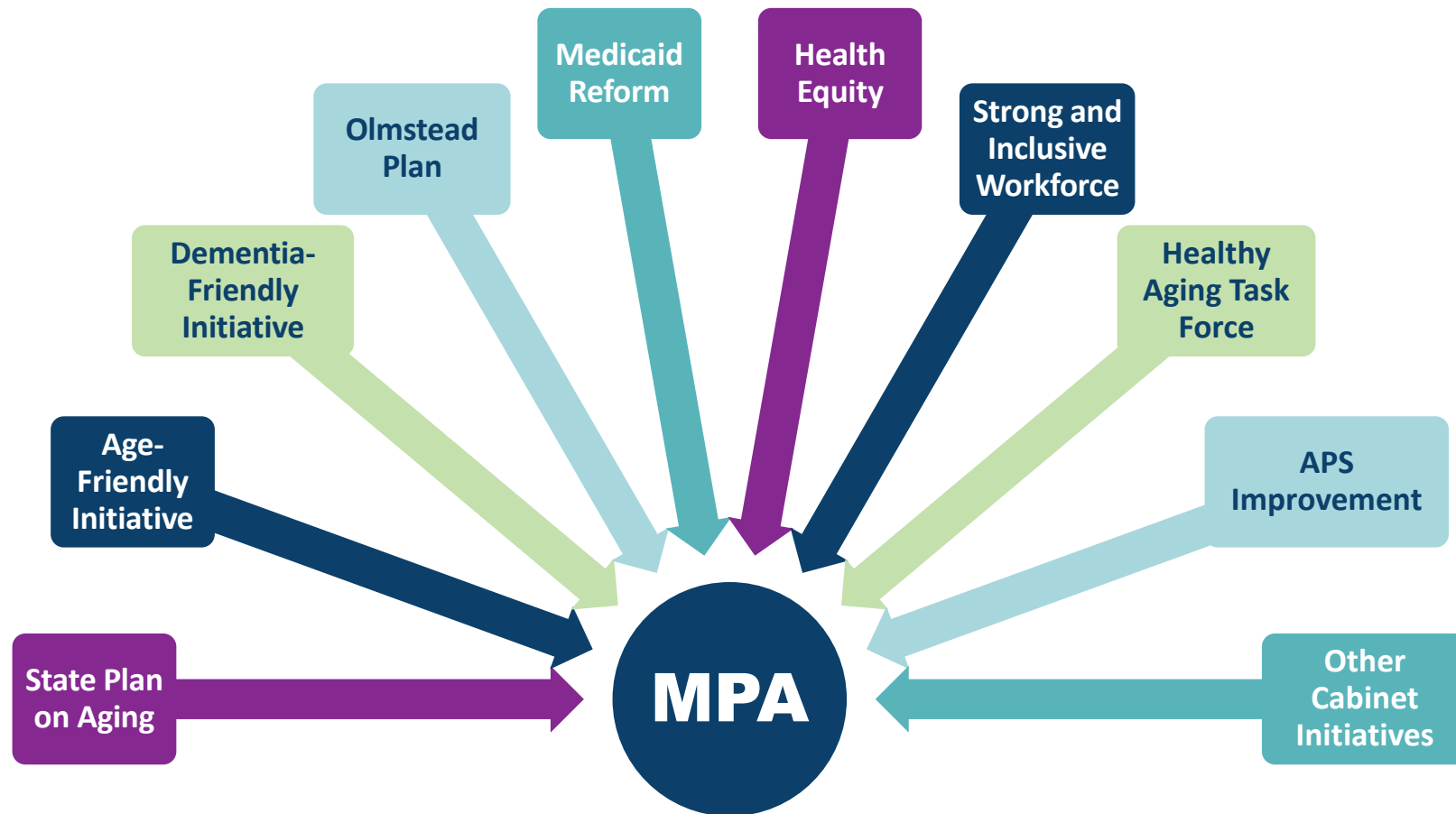

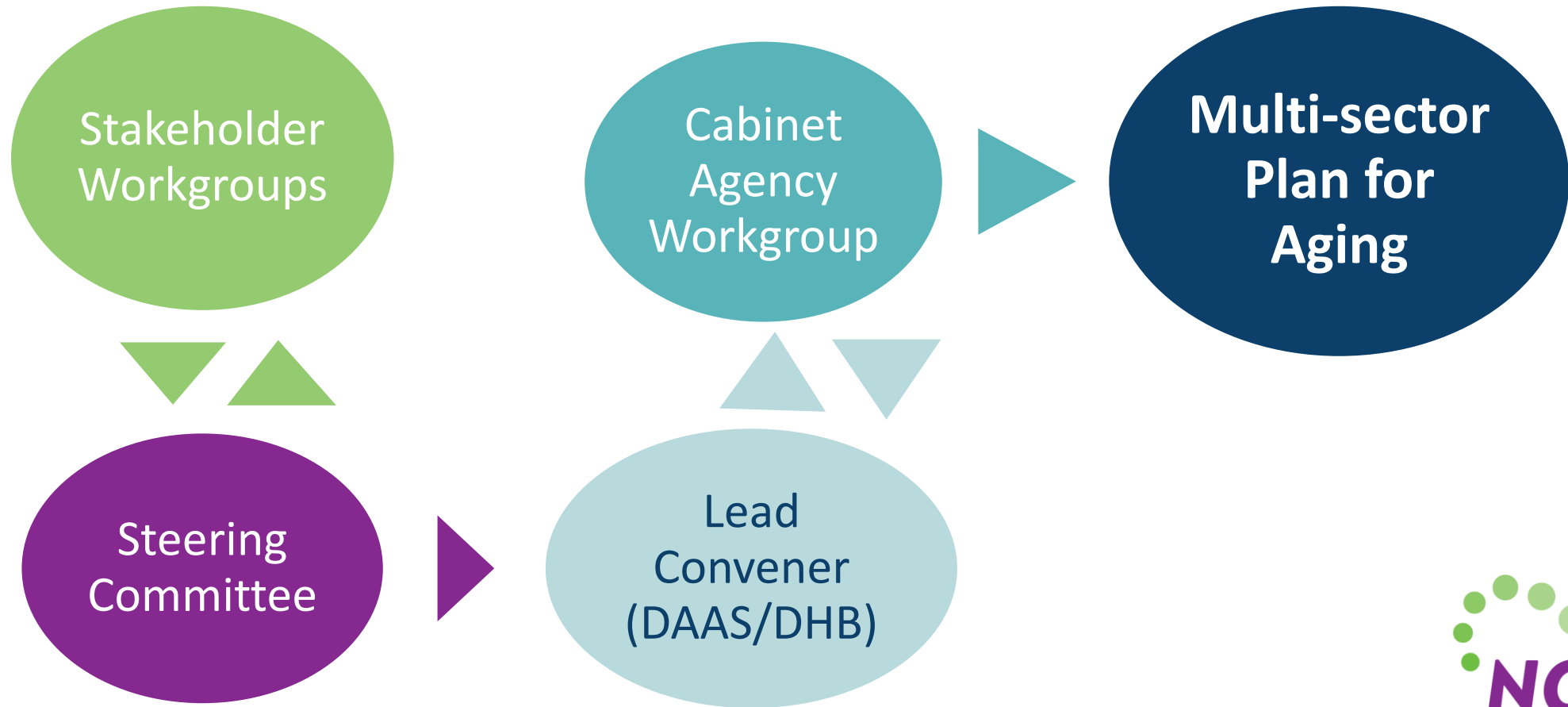

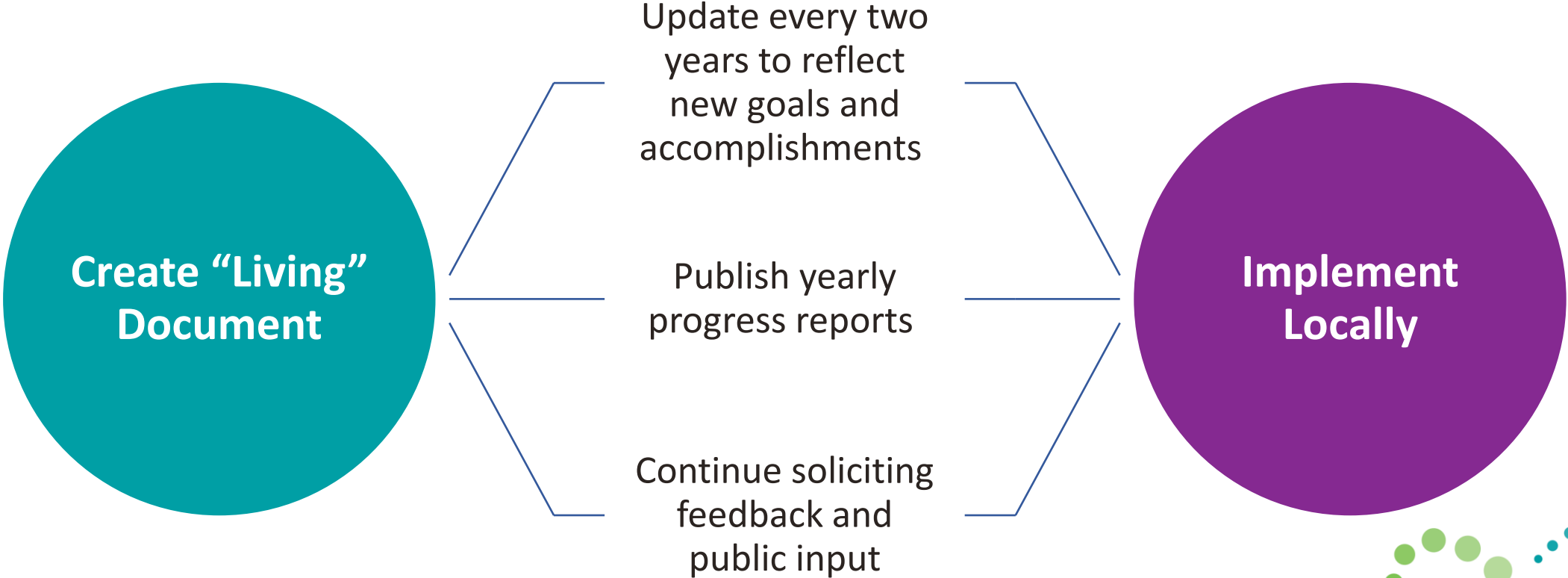
