Subject: Child Nutrition Income Eligibility Guidelines July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019

Included in this memorandum are the Income Eligibility Guidelines for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019 to be used by institutions and facilities participating in the CACFP. All institutions in the CACFP must have on file an Income Eligibility Application for each enrolled participant who is classified as free or reduced. If an Income Eligibility Application is not on file for a participant, that participant will be classified as denied.

Child Care Centers use CAC-11: Child Income Eligibility Application, which is to be completed by a parent or guardian of the participant(s). These forms must be updated annually. CACFP child care institutions have some flexibility concerning the effective date of certification for Program benefits. For further information regarding this flexibility refer to CACFP 14-03 Effective Date of Free and Reduced-Price Meal Eligibility Determinations.

Adult Day Care Centers must have on file *CAC-11A*: Adult Income Eligibility Application, which must be signed by the participant or an adult household member. These forms do not require annual updates.

Sponsoring Organizations of Day Care Homes use form CAC-11B: Children Enrolled in Family Day Care Homes. These Income Eligibility Applications must be completed by a parent or guardian of the enrolled participant(s) and updated annually. Form CAC-11C: CACFP Eligibility Application – Family Day Care Homes Providers' Income and Provider's Own Children must also be updated annually.

¹ Eligibility applications are not required for children participating in the At-Risk Afterschool Meals Program or for children up to age 18 and persons with disabilities regardless of age who participate in Emergency shelters.
