



Child First provides mental health intervention and support services through a proven home visiting model that builds and strengthens relationships between caregivers and their children. As a two-generation model, Child First partners with families to address the challenges, stressors, and traumas they experience, create an environment to foster healthy child development, and connect with needed services and resources in their communities.

Child First is a comprehensive model that is fully integrated into the system of care of early childhood and young adult services in each region.

Who Child First Serves

Child First partners with caregivers who have infants and young children, from birth through age five. The program works with families who have experienced trauma and other adversities (such as poverty, mental health challenges, housing insecurity, or abuse and neglect), or whose children are experiencing emotional, behavioral, learning, or developmental challenges.

Children must have North Carolina Medicaid to be eligible for services.

ABOUT CHILD FIRST

Child First is an evidence-based, mental health home visiting program that partners with families, infants, and young children from pregnancy through age 5, to enhance strong, loving relationships.

HEALING CHILDREN AND FAMILIES FROM THE EFFECTS OF TRAUMA AND ADVERSITY

Child First succeeds in supporting caregivers and their children process the stresses and traumas in their lives while enhancing healthy patterns of interactions between them. The intervention serves families and children, from birth to age five, experiencing multiple challenges such as extreme poverty, maternal depression, domestic violence, substance use, homelessness, abuse and neglect, incarceration, and isolation. These challenges lead to levels of stress that can be toxic to the young, developing brain and without the buffer of strong, nurturing relationships this can result in long-term emotional/behavioral, learning and health problems.

A COMPREHENSIVE INFANT/EARLY CHILDHOOD MENTAL HEALTH MODEL

Child First is provided by a team consisting of a mental health clinician and a care coordinator, who support a family through both joint and individual sessions depending on the identified needs. In addressing concerns proactively and early in the family's development, the Child First intervention serves to positively change the ways in which the family system operates, leading to healthier trajectories for the family in the long term.

- **Two-Generation, Mental Health Treatment:**
Master's level mental health clinician facilitates the development of responsive, nurturing parent-child relationships that can protect the child's developing brain from stress and adversity AND promote behavioral health and cognitive development.
- **Comprehensive Care Coordination:**
Family resource partner provides hands-on support and connection to community-based services for all family members, leading to family stabilization and a reduction in major family stressors (e.g., homelessness, food insecurity, lack of health care, unemployment).


