SUBJECT: EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA) AND EDUCATIONAL STABILITY WEBINAR

PURPOSE: TO NOTIFY COUNTY DSS OF UPCOMING WEBINAR

In 2015, Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) was signed into law. A component of ESSA is to uphold critical connections for America's disadvantaged and high-need students. Children and youth experiencing foster care are eligible for additional supports as a result of ESSA. These provisions (ESSA Foster Care) complement the requirements of the Fostering Connections to Success and Increasing Adoptions Act of 2008 (Fostering Connections Act). Together these laws strengthen opportunities for educational agencies and child welfare agencies to jointly determine the most effective practices and promote school stability and success for students.

For the Department of Public Instruction (DPI), ESSA required greater protections for all disadvantaged and high-need students, including students in foster care, and requirements that the academic performance for these students be tracked. To facilitate implementation of ESSA as it applied to students in the custody of a county child welfare agency, DPI partnered with the SERVE Center at The University of North Carolina at Greensboro. SERVE provides technical guidance and support to all local education agencies and works to ensure DPI complies with ESSA requirements.

NCDSS and NC DPI will be hosting a joint webinar titled "Educational Stability of Students in Foster Care" on 3/19/24. This webinar is open to child welfare agencies and local education agencies to explore the following:

- Every Student Succeeds Act
- Responsibilities of Local Education Agencies (LEAs)
- Responsibilities of Local Department of Social Services (DSS)
- Examples of collaboration at the local level
