These documents provide an opportunity for all of us — as child welfare leaders and partners — to reflect on what is working well in our system and where we must improve.

While North Carolina's results mirror the challenges seen in child welfare systems nationwide, we are encouraged that the statewide transformation we've been working toward over the last several years is on the right track. Areas where we fell short are the very same areas where bold, systemic change is already underway across our state. The CFSR results affirm that the reforms we are advancing — including implementing PATH NC, improving coordination across child-serving systems, expanding permanency services, and strengthening our child welfare workforce — are focused on the right priorities.

In the coming weeks, NCDHHS will host an all-county and stakeholder meeting to provide an overview of the CFSR findings and invite your input as we develop North Carolina's federally required Program Improvement Plan (PIP), due within 90 days of receipt of the final CFSR report. We look forward to this collaborative discussion and the opportunity to work together to chart our path forward.
