PURPOSE: NOTIFICATION OF LINKS: SUMMER SESSION: 2024

As a step towards expanding continuous youth partnerships, strengthening local LINKS programs, and providing teens and young adults the opportunity to develop skill sets needed for employment, North Carolina Division of Social Services (NCDSS) is excited to offer **LINKS: Summer Session 2024**.

This time-limited summer internship opportunity supports county-level feedback loops, youth engagement, and partnership on local levels. Young adults will gain knowledge on county and state level social services structure, acquire transferable skills for future employment, and connect with a professional network. Counties and young adults have two avenues to participate in this opportunity.

- 1. County-level Counties can elect to participate in LINKS: Summer Session 2024 on a county-level basis. Counties will select a LINKS eligible youth or young adult to draft a project to support their local LINKS programming. Each youth will be able to list their involvement on their resume, receive community service hours for participation, and receive a one-time incentive of \$800 for successful completion of the session. To submit notice of intent to participate, counties should attend one of the sessions listed below and complete the following registration: County-Level Participation Notice .
- 2. **State-level** Young adults with lived experience can elect to participate in **LINKS**: **Summer Session 2024** on the state-level. Eligible young adults would apply for selection. The State-level application for young adults can be accessed at the following link: <u>State-level Application</u>. Upon successful completion of the session, young adults will be able to list their involvement on their resume, receive community service hours for their participation, a laptop, and a one-time incentive of \$1200.
