She is serving on the membership engagement team with the Medicaid Care Advisory Committee. That committee is seeking consumer input. One of her concerns is how are recipients going to be educated on what the best plans are. She feels this will result in people getting the wrong plan and possibly going without the services they need and an increase in Emergency Department usage. She is recommending training for DSS Social Workers to educate them about the new system and the different plans that people can choose. She stated that DSS workers are already heavily burdened. Once a person has chosen a plan they are locked in for a year after an initial 90-day period. She would like to see this policy changed. She felt that the committee did listen to her concerns and stated they have similar concerns and read a statement from an email to that effect. She would like the SCFAC member to provide input into these issues and plans to send in her comments after the SCFAC meeting in May.
