The North Carolina Department of Insurance assists prospective residents in their search for continuing care retirement communities (CCRC). A continuing care community can provide a continuum of care to older adults under a contract for the life of an individual, or for a period longer than one year. Continuing care may also include home care services provided or arranged by a CCRC to an individual who has entered into a continuing care contract, but who prefers to remain in their home and may opt to receive on-site lodging at a future date.

Continuing care laws in North Carolina are designed to provide full disclosure concerning a community prior to the execution of a contract.
