Subject: Intensive Family Preservation Services (IFPS)

Effective Immediately

North Carolina's Intensive Family Preservation Service (IFPS) Program, as established in legislation (GS 143B-150.5), is a short-term, intensive, crisis-intervention program with services provided primarily in the family's home or community. The purpose of the Program is, where feasible and in the best interest of the child and family, to keep the family unit intact by providing intensive family centered services that help create positive long-term changes in the home environment. We now have state-funded Intensive Family Preservation Services in 59 counties and the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians.

The policies and procedures for the Program have recently been revised to encompass the existing IFPS and the IFPS Expansion programs. These revisions include referral standards to meet the legislative requirement that "the revised IFPS Program shall ensure the application of standardized assessment criteria for determining imminent risk and clear criteria for determining out-of-home placement."

The document is titled 'IFPS Policies and Procedures: Effective April 2001

As part of the application process for Intensive Family Preservation Services, it is now a requirement that all county DSS referrals for these services must include a copy of

- 1. Report to Central Registry Form, DSS-5104
- 2. Services Information System: Client Entry Form, DSS-5027
- 3. Risk Assessment, DSS-5149.

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Please ensure that all Child Welfare staff are informed of and comply with this requirement.

In addition to the recent changes in IFPS Policies and Procedures, other issues related to IFPS have received attention from the General Assembly and the Federal Child and Family Services Review. In the course of developing a Program Improvement Plan in response to the Federal Review, and as a result of Special Provisions proposed in the current state budget, the Division has identified three primary issues related to IFPS that need to be addressed:

- 1. Access to IFPS service by minorities (the population served by IFPS should reflect the client population involved with Child Protective Services in that county).
- 2. The need for strategies to extend the impact of IFPS services (*Evaluation of IFPS* programs indicate a high rate of success in keeping children out of placement, but this treatment appears to weaken over time without appropriate follow-up services).
- 3. Improvement of the connection between IFPS programs and achievement of academic success (academic success has received increasing emphasis from the General Assembly and identified as an area where North Carolina was "not in substantial conformity" in the Federal Child and Family Services Review).

Feedback from county DSS Directors is needed to help the Division develop a plan focusing on the above concerns. These issues will be discussed in upcoming meetings and we look forward to your input.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation with the IFPS requirements for DSS referrals. Attached is a list of IFPS Programs funded by the NC Division of Social Services.
