### What is NC-PALS?

NC-PALS, the North Carolina Post-Adoption Life Study, is about life experiences of young people who were adopted from foster care in North Carolina. Child Trends and the University of Wisconsin are conducting this study, with funding from The Duke Endowment.

#### What is the purpose?

To learn how young people like you, who were adopted from foster care in North Carolina, are doing as young adults, and to understand your experiences with, and opinions about foster care and adoption.

#### How do I participate?

When you turn 18, we would like to interview you, in person, about your life experiences and opinions about foster care and adoption. The interview takes 1 to 1 ½ hours, and you receive \$50 cash for participating!

### How do I sign up?
