SUBJECT: RESOURCE PARENT CURRICULUM TRAIN-THE-TRAINER OPPORTUNITY

NC DSS is pleased to offer a comprehensive train-the-trainer event for the National Child Traumatic Stress Network (NCTSN) in-service training for foster, adoptive and kinship parents called *Caring for Children Who Have Experienced Trauma: A Workshop for Resource Parents* (RPC). RPC is a trauma-informed 16-hour in-service training that has shifted the way our parents are working with youth. While it is a publically available curriculum, we have found that it can be *very complicated* to deliver. This training is for Staff Facilitators (the lead trainer). We encourage one to three individuals from interested agencies to apply. If selected, each Staff Facilitator-in-Training will be required to do significant prework and participate in consultation calls prior to a three-day face-to-face training in March 8 – 10, 2016 (to be held in the Raleigh/Durham area).
