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ATTENTION: CHILD WELFARE PROGRAM ADMINISTRATORS, MANAGERS, SUPERVISORS, AND WORKERS AND COUNTY FISCAL STAFF

SUBJECT: CPS TANF TRANSFERRED TO SSBG (FORMERLY CPS EXPANSION) FUNDING

During the 2011 session of the North Carolina General Assembly authorized Session Law 2011-145 (<u>http://www.ncga.state.nc.us/Sessions/2011/Bills/House/PDF/H200v9.pdf</u>) which allocated that local county departments of social services may use funds referred to as "CPS Expansion Funds" to pay for Child Protective Services staff. In order to accomplish this, local departments will utilize funds that have been transferred into the Social Services Block Grant (SSBG). The Program Code for these funds is "23". This appropriation, along with others in the past, (please refer to Administrative Letter 10-06 at: <u>http://info.dhhs.state.nc.us/olm/manuals/dss/csm-05/man/FSCW_AL_1006.htm#P10_208</u>), was made in order to assist counties in maintaining lower caseloads as a result of recommendations to assist in the implementation of MRS.

When using Service Codes 210, 215^{*}, 219^{*}, 220, 228, 229, 230, 330, and 390 (<u>SIS - Change Notice 01-11</u>) a child is eligible for "23" funding if the following criteria are met:

- 1. The family's income is at or below 200% of the current Federal Poverty Level (FPL) (2011 Poverty Guidelines, Federal Register Notice). In determining whether a family meets this income standard, social workers may use information from agency records showing that the family receives Work First payments, Medicaid or Health Choice, or Food and Nutrition Assistance. If agency records are inconclusive, the social worker may obtain this type of information from the family. The income must be documented in the record; however, it is not necessary to obtain written verification of the income amount. When a child is living in the home of a specified relative other than his parent(s), the relative's income is not considered in determining the child's eligibility.
- 2. The child must be a United States citizen or a qualified alien.

* Note that for Service Codes 215 and 219 an additional criteria exists before Program Code 23 may be used – cases must have a "low" risk level as documented on the North Carolina SDM[®] Family Risk Assessment of Child Abuse/Neglect (<u>DSS-5230</u>).

Documentation of eligibility will be made on the DSS-5339, which can be found on the forms website at: <u>http://info.dhhs.state.nc.us/olm/forms/forms.aspx?dc=dss</u>. Redetermination is not required for these funds.
