Re: Program Integrity Claims Without Debtors in EPICS

As a result of Food and Nutrition Services and Work First Family Assistance Program Integrity Reviews conducted earlier this year, Client Services Data Warehouse has published a new State Sanctioned report that identifies established claims without debtors entered on the debtor detail screen. The name of this report is Claims Without Debtors. The CSDW website is http://www.csdw.dhhs.state.nc.us/.

The report looks at claims that are entered in the Enterprise Program Integrity Control System (EPICS) and list the claim(s) that do not have a debtor attached. The first step to collecting a claim is to add the debtor(s) to claims. When a debtor is added, the Letter of Overissuance is generated and mailed. Collections from recoupments, TOP, DOR, and NCEL are all generated from Debtor Detail in EPICS.

Counties must access CSDW and retrieve this report for their county. Some counties will not have a claim listed. Enter debtor(s) for all claims identified as without a debtor by Monday, January 3, 2011. Follow policy in section 815.08 in selecting and entering debtors. This report will be reviewed at Program Integrity Reviews in 2011 and ongoing.
