Re: Social Security/Supplemental Security Income (SSI) Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) Information for 2011

## **Dear County Director of Social Services:**

**Attention:** Food and Nutrition Services Managers and Supervisors Program Integrity Managers and Supervisors

Legislation enacted in 1973 provides for cost-of-living adjustments, or COLAs. With COLAs, Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits keep pace with inflation. In general, the COLA is equal to a percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index. If there is no increase in the Consumer Price Index, then there is no COLA. In 2011, Social Security/Supplemental Security Income benefits <u>will not</u> have cost of living adjustments due to the decline in consumer prices and the expected low inflation.

Most Medicare beneficiaries will continue to pay the same Part B premium amount in 2011. Beneficiaries who currently have the Social Security Administration (SSA) withhold their Part B premium and have incomes of \$85,000 or less (\$170,000 or less for joint filers) will not have an increase in their Part B premium for 2011.
