RE: Potential ABAWD Funding

Dear County Director of Social Services:

Attention: Food Stamp Supervisors

The Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002, "the Farm Bill," which reauthorized the Food Stamp Program also authorized \$20 million annually to be allocated among States that make a commitment to offer and provide a qualifying education, training or Workfare opportunity that meets the participation requirements for "at risk" able bodied adults without dependents (ABAWDs). An at-risk ABAWD is defined as an 18-50 year old who is in the last month of their three month certification, and who resides in an area subject to the Food Stamp Program Employment and Training requirements, and who is not included in the 15% ABAWD exemption allowance.

We are canvassing non-waiver E&T counties to assess the interest in participating in this initiative. Only if a majority of counties express an interest will North Carolina submit a proposal to the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). If NC secures a portion of the \$20 million, all non-waiver E&T counties must participate in this initiative. Also, please know this is 100% funding with no county match required. The funding can be used for contracting with other organizations to provide services, administration, educational training programs, etc. For example, another state is proposing to work with ABAWDs recently released from prison and alcohol and drug rehabilitation centers. Currently, Wilson County contracts with community agencies to provide ABAWDs with work experience to help maintain their food stamp eligibility. Please know that if additional funds are secured, the funds must be used exclusively to serve at-risk ABAWDs and cannot be carried over to the next year.

If you have specific ideas about a particular ABAWD project, please forward that proposal to David Prince at the above address, along with the estimated associated costs. We will evaluate the proposals received to develop, with your input, a statewide plan.

If you think your county is interested in providing additional services to ABAWDs, please fax the attached document to David Prince, E&T Coordinator at 919-733-0645. You can reach him by phone at 919-733-4570. The deadline for receipt of the form and/or your proposal is April 15, 2003. The E&T State Plan must be submitted to USDA by August 15, 2003.
