Subject: Revised NC FAST Implementation Approach and Schedule for Counties

Dear County Director of Social Services:

Based on input received from our pilot counties during initial NC FAST go-live, we have revised the implementation and training approach. The new schedule is attached, and reflects the updated rollout and training dates. Input came from pilot surveys, pilot county leadership meetings, onsite support staff and daily county champion calls.

As you know, the NC FAST system has been in pilot production since May 21, 2012. The pilot has been successful with a few challenges as expected. DHHS and the pilot counties have learned a great deal, and we refined the process for training and rollout based on the many lessons learned.

In general, training will be more task-oriented to a caseworker's job, and classroom activities will provide complete steps for processes, such as new applications, changes in circumstance and recertifications. We have partnered with FNS representatives to create scenarios based on actual FNS cases. We have also created knowledge checks during training to determine where additional training is needed before go-live.

In this updated approach, classroom training will be delivered 1–4 weeks before go-live. Prior to classroom training, a pre-training workbook will be available, and staff will have access to a Sandbox test site where they can practice basic NC FAST functions. Classroom training will be conducted Monday through Friday.

The Monday following classroom training, county staff will have a "soft launch" into the Production system. The newly trained county staff will have access to the live NC FAST production system, but be able to enter new applications only. They will continue to have access to the Sandbox test site to practice other NC FAST functionality, such as processing recertifications and changes in circumstance. This soft launch approach was tested in Buncombe County and has been very successful in easing staff into using NC FAST.

Once all county staff have completed classroom training, NC FAST County Readiness and DHHS DSS staff will conduct a readiness assessment to determine when each county will be ready for its "hard launch" into the production system. The hard launch will convert all cases from FSIS into NC FAST. At this point, access to FSIS will be turned off for all county staff. All new applications, recertifications, changes in circumstances and all other transactions will be completed using NC FAST going forward.

There will be one hard launch per month, which is scheduled for mid-month. This timing will allow counties to perform their timely recertifications in FSIS prior to conversion. Counties will be scheduled for their hard launch based on their readiness.

Phase 1 training is on schedule to be delivered July 23-August 17, and Phases 2 through 5 will receive their training through the end of the year, with the exception of the week of Thanksgiving and the week of Christmas. NC FAST County Readiness staff will be working with counties in each implementation phase to identify and confirm regional training locations in the near future.

We greatly appreciate the hard work and dedication of the pilot county leadership, staff and supervisors. The feedback they provided will greatly benefit the process of bringing additional counties into NC FAST. We are confident that the adjustments made to the implementation and training approach will create as smooth a transition as possible to NC FAST.
