In re A.P.: Who can file a A/N/D petition?

§ 7B-401.1. Parties.

(a) Petitioner. – Only a county <u>director</u> of social services or the director's authorized representative may file a petition alleging that a juvenile is abused, neglected, or dependent. The petitioner shall remain a party until the court terminates its jurisdiction in the case.

+

§7B-101. Definitions.

As used in this Subchapter, unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the following words have the listed meanings:

(10) Director. – The director of the county department of social services in the county in which the juvenile resides or is found, or the director's representative as authorized in G.S. 108A-14.

In re A.P.:

"only the director of the county department of social services, or the director's representative, "in the county in which the juvenile resides or is *found*" has standing to file a petition alleging that a child is an abused, neglected, or dependent juvenile."

What about conflicts and NCGS 7B-400(b)?

In re A.P. did not address conflict cases

§ 7B-400. Venue.

(b) When the director in one county conducts an assessment pursuant to G.S. 7B-302 in another county because a conflict of interest exists, the director in the county conducting the assessment may file a resulting petition in either county.

Does changing venue change the parties?
