The Alliance is chaired by Brian Ingraham, CEO of Vaya Hea Alliance members plan to focus on four key areas: Expanding medication-assisted treatment (MAT) 			
• Discussion	 Vaya CFAC is working on a project to improve the Person Centered Planning process by assisting members to better understand and prepare for their Person Centered Plan sessions with providers. Two CFAC members serve on the Clinical Advisory Committee and are working on a subcommittee for this project. Feedback from each Local Vaya CFAC group was gathered during the March 2017 meetings. Some of the outcomes we hope for are tip sheets or printed guides to help individuals know what to think about before their planning meetings, and recommendations for providers to involve individuals more in the process. The inaugural Blue Ridge Recovery Rally took place Saturday, April 29, 2017 from 3-7 p.m. in Marion (McDowell County). Vaya Health was a platinum community sponsor of this event. The rally included free food and drinks, music, recovery walk, children's activities, personal recovery stories, Recovery Champion of the Year awards, and more. Vaya CFAC manned an information table at the event. The focus of this event was to promote recovery on the community level. Vaya has installed MindKare Kiosks in six counties, with plans in progress to install them in all 22 counties this year. The kincks allow community members to complete simple.
