Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) helps people with disabilities achieve their employment goals. If you have a disability and want to find a job, keep working, or advance professionally, VR can help you chart your path to a career with a future in North Carolina.

How will VR help me?

VR can provide counseling, education, training, job placement assistance, assistive technology, and many other services, depending on what you need to meet your goals for employment.

How do I apply?

Will I lose benefits if I try to work?

If you receive SSI/SSDI based on a disability and want to go to work, call **1-800-215-7227.** There are safeguards to protect your benefits while you get the resources, training and support you need to build a successful career.

How much do I have to pay?

There is no cost to apply. Some VR services are provided completely free-of-charge to eligible individuals and VR can help you identify other funding sources to reduce the costs of other services.

VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION PROCESS			
1		Eligibility Determination	If a disability prevents you from finding or keeping a job, you may be eligible.
2	ð	Needs Assessment	We'll assess your experience, skills, abilities, as well as any barriers to employment.
3		Plan Development	A VR counselor will help you establish goals for employment and a plan to achieve them.
4	Y	Plan Implementation	We'll monitor progress, making sure that you receive the services you need to succeed.
5		Ongoing Support	When you are ready to work, we help you get hired and make sure you have the support needed to keep working.
