**Subject:** **2026 North Carolina SUN Bucks (S-EBT) – Benefits Issuances**

**Priority:** Information for Awareness and Action

**Dear County Directors of Social Services:**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) SUN Bucks program returns for 2026 providing a one-benefit of \$120 in food assistance on a debit-like EBT card for each qualifying student for food during the summer months when schools are out. In North Carolina, the SUN Bucks program is administered by the NC Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS) in partnership with the NC Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI). As the 2026 SUN Bucks program ramps up, we want to share additional information about eligibility, benefit issuance, and resources available for promotion and the minimal role of DSS staff this year.

**Eligibility**

Many students will automatically qualify for the SUN Bucks benefit, while others will need to apply. Families wishing to apply should visit the [NCDHHS SUN Bucks Homepage](#) for-eligibility information and FAQs. There, families can also access the interactive eligibility quiz. Families are encouraged to take the [interactive eligibility quiz](#) to find out if their child may be eligible or if they should apply.

The following children are **automatically eligible** and **do not need to apply**:

- The child is enrolled in a National School Lunch Program ([NSLP](#)) school and they have an approved Free or Reduced-Price (FRP) meals application or were directly verified to receive FRP meals.
- A SUN Bucks application was submitted after July 1<sup>st</sup> last year and was approved. A new application for summer 2026 is not needed as long as the child is still enrolled in a NSLP/Community Eligibility Provision ([CEP](#)) participating school.
- The child is enrolled in a CEP school and participates in one of the programs listed below (regardless of age).

**OR**

The child is between ages 7 – 16 at any time during the school year or the following summer and they participate in at least one of the programs below:

- Food and Nutrition Services (FNS), **or**
- Work First, **or**
- Medicaid and has a household income of less than 185% of the federal poverty level, **or**
- Cherokee Tribal Food Distribution Program (CTFDP), **or**

- Child is in Foster Care, **or**
- Child is enrolled in the McKinney-Vento program (program for homeless youth)

Students not participating in any of these programs but who do attend a NSLP/CEP school and who meet income eligibility requirements can apply through the [SUN Bucks application website](#). Paper applications are available on the website to download; however, completing the application online is encouraged, as these are typically processed more quickly. Applications of households that applied after July 1<sup>st</sup> last year, will be used to determine eligibility in the 2026 SUN Bucks program as well. Others who wish to apply must do so by the August 15<sup>th</sup> deadline.

**Issuances:** A one-time payment of \$120 per eligible child will be issued for the summer.

All eligible families will receive a new SUN Bucks card with specific information on how to activate and PIN the card. Card distribution begins in May and continues throughout the summer, with additional benefit cards mailed every two weeks through September as more children qualify.

Some households may receive their SUN Bucks card before benefits are available to use, as benefits typically begin being issued in mid-May, but benefits are not available until the summer period begins. Families are encouraged to be patient if they do not see their benefits immediately.

## DSS Role

Counties play an important role in helping eligible students receive their benefits during the summer, including:

- SUN Bucks cards are mailed to the county DSS offices only for children in foster care and a small number of households that directly use DSS as their mailing address.
- **Children in foster care:** Cards for children in foster care will also be mailed to the county DSS office. Foster Care Social Workers are responsible for ensuring these children receive their cards and that the cards follow the child to each placement.
- **Households with DSS as their address:** These cards should be distributed in the same manner as other mail or cards received on behalf of households.

All households for which a valid mailing address is unknown will be notified that they must contact the SUN Bucks call center to provide an address to receive their card.

Follow your county's established procedures for handling the FNS undeliverable card report. Counties should not process any reports related to SUN Bucks cards, as NCDHHS manages undeliverable card reports for SUN Bucks-only cases.

Any remaining SUN Bucks cards from **2025** should not be distributed, as the benefits have expired. Clients may be advised to destroy old cards, as new cards will be issued for the **2026** benefit period. County DSS offices are **NOT** responsible for assisting clients with creating an activation code or PIN (personal identification number) for SUN Bucks cards. For assistance, clients should contact the North Carolina EBT Call Center at 1-866-719-0141, select their language, and choose option 2 to speak with a SUN Bucks representative.



In addition to receiving SUN Bucks, families also are encouraged to have their children, ages 18 and younger, participate in other federal Summer Nutrition Programs available at no cost to them. Through SUN Meals, kids and teens can eat meals and snacks and engage in fun, fitness and educational activities during the summer at schools, parks, camps, and other neighborhood locations. In rural areas where it may be difficult to access and participate in SUN Meals, SUN Meals To-Go may be available for pick up or delivery.
