Your baby passed their newborn hearing screening but has one or more risk factors that can cause hearing loss after birth. It is important to identify hearing loss early so that your child meets speech and language milestones. ASK YOUR DOCTOR where to follow up based on the following checklist.

If your baby has had any of the following,
schedule a hearing evaluation by
3 months of age:

- CMV, meningitis, encephalitis
- 🔲 Zika virus
- Chemotherapy
- Significant head trauma

If your baby has had any of the following, schedule a hearing evaluation by 9 months of age:

- Family history of permanent childhood hearing loss
- □ NICU stay of more than 5 days
- Hyperbilirubinemia with blood transfusion
- Ototoxic antibiotics for more than 5 days
- Conditions associated with lack of oxygen at birth
- In utero infections, such as herpes, rubella, syphilis, toxoplasmosis
- Ear malformations, cleft lip/palate and microphthalmia
- Microcephaly or hydrocephalus
- Temporal bone abnormalities
- Syndromes associated with hearing loss
