3rd Sharron Nixon Grinshaw: Spoke on the Peet Process – Having peers trained on completing the CCA (Clinical Care Assessment) she expressed her frustration over the process that is in place at this time. Ms Grinshaw stated that the instructions were not clear and that it took her over weeks to get this document completed and that is when she discovered that there was a link that would take her to a Licensed Therapist to assist with the process.

4th Pat McGinnis: Spoke about concerns regarding 122c-Stated that the community is feeling that they are disposable secondary to some of the changes that are being proposed in the draft. "Voices of the CFAC cannot go away and CFAC needs to be supported, we need to support the community voices. – Board makeup -if the changes are approved as written then the VAYA board will lose all the CFAC representatives that are now sitting on the board. It is an honor to be allowed to sit on the board as a voting member but at this time we do not make the board representatives have to be chairs, nor should it be. Our CFAC feels that if the changes in 122c are approved as written we will be sitting in an empty room. – There is a learning curve for CFAC Members and for Board members and for some, it takes several years before they feel comfortable to even say anything.

5th Jean Andersen- spoke on 122c- spoke on concerns of a recent Partners CFAC meeting that the corporate Lawyer for Partners called a closed meeting and would not allow anyone that was not a Partners CFAC member to be in the meeting. The information that he provided on 122c was incorrect and the information that he provided on the makeup of the SCFAC was incorrect. It also appeared that the information that he was provided seemed to be made so that the CFAC would use their voice to support his wishes. **Motion Made with Discussion:**

- What is Changing:
- Tailored Plan member will begin receiving health care services and medications from their Tailored Plan (LME)
- Tailored Plan Members must have a Primary Care Provider (PCP) and a Tailored Care Management provider in the Tailored Plan Network.
- In Late April all Tailored Plan members will receive a letter that provides them with additional information

8. DHB Update Deputy Director Jay Ladlum; Greg Daniels, Lacosta Parker

- Medicaid Expansion- the work continues making sure that they reach all that could benefit from the expansion, working with community organizations to help identify those that could benefit.
- Joint Legislative meetings with DHB are taking place and are open and he is encouraging the committee to listen in they will be taking place until April.
- PDN updates- Standard plans should be addressing them the same as LMEs – there are some differences across the companies – should address this with the Standard Plans.
- Size of Trillium- this was addressed in Secretary Kinsley's release that took place in Nov '23. strength of the Program Protect members. The Secretary did have meetings with providers, and stakeholders, and it may not have shacked out the way they wanted it is the way that would provide strength to the program and protection to the members.
- Greg Daniels- 1915i stat's-4484 on the 1915i waiver,2014 on the B waiver, 213 not active, 191 on the waiver. Barriers: TCM agencies – Education- Strengthen relationships with MCO to make sure they are not being left behind. Individuals who are now adults who will need this waiver are in the process of being identified.

- Innovations Draft has been posted and is up for 30 days to allow public comment. – there have been minimal changes to it.
- 7/1/24 a new waiver will need to be done secondary to the 5-year waiver will be ending. Currently, the staff is already working on the new waiver. They have started having meetings with the SCFAC EOR subcommittee (ad hoc) and will be meeting with other groups soon.
- TBI waiver expansion has started, and we are working with the LME's concerning this expansion and we have hired an outside group to assist with the expansion.
- TBI work group to start March 2024
