The North Carolina Community Foundation Disaster Relief Fund provides grants focused on long-term recovery efforts to community organizations in North Carolina impacted by disasters. Note these funds are primarily distributed through affiliate foundations within impacted areas, and decisions related to the grant distributions are made by the affiliate foundations.

# US Department of Labor Disaster Unemployment Assistance (DUA)

DUA provides financial assistance to individuals whose employment or self-employment has been lost or interrupted as a direct result of a major disaster and who are not eligible for regular unemployment insurance benefits.
