



New NCDHHS State Health Director



Lawrence H. Greenblatt, MD

- Dr. Lawrence Greenblatt was appointed as State Health Director and Chief Medical Officer for NCDHHS and began his duties on Monday, June 2
- He brings over 30 years of experience as a general internist, educator, and leader in Medicaid policy at Duke University Health System, where he spearheaded efforts to integrate behavioral health and addiction services into primary care
- He launched one of the nation's first academic initiatives to promote safe opioid prescribing and expand treatment for opioid use disorder, and has co-led major initiatives like the Durham Crisis Collaborative to improve local mental health planning






County Representation and Impact Since 2017
