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	INTRODUCTION ELIGIBILITY

1.0 INTRODUCTION

North Carolina Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities and Substance Abuse Services (DMH/DD/SAS) is looking to partner with a statewide family and youth advocacy and support organization. This organization will enhance North Carolina's System of Care (SOC) by:

- a. Developing a skilled workforce of family and youth peer support individuals who can reach out to families and youths who would not ordinarily be identified by or engaged by the behavioral health system while supporting those whose needs are not being met by the current behavioral health system.
- b. Creating an educational and supportive environment that supports families and youth in identifying their own strengths and resources for the purpose of creating and implementing plans that lead to positive outcomes and independence from the behavioral health, juvenile justice, and social service systems.
- c. Establishing a network of family and youth representatives who engage with local SOC collaboratives and local child/youth service leadership to influence the local SOC development within the collaboratives' communities.
- d. Influencing the development of policies and procedures that will sustain peer support while serving to orient NC's service delivery focus towards the goal of becoming Family and Youth Driven.
- e. Developing a statewide curriculum, training, and certification program for family/youth peer support.
- f. Providing technical assistance and consultation to DMH/DD/SAS on policy and procedural development.

1.1 PURPOSE

The Statewide Family and Youth Advocacy Organization's primary mission is to support and advocate for children, youth, and young adults with behavioral health needs along with their families. The organization would have the statewide (or potential for statewide) capacity to:

- Support families and youth, both individually and collectively
- Conduct workforce development planning, training, and consultation
- Promote the voice of the family and youth at all levels and in all settings
- Provide guidance on local and state policy and procedures
- Work inclusively with a wide range of family leaders or family representatives
- Link families to partners across the State to address the needs identified by the children, youth, and families they serve
- Recruit and encourage the recruitment of family caregivers, youth, and young adults for participation at the local and state SOC collaboratives and advise on strategies to support their ongoing participation
- Foster leadership skills among family caregivers, youth, and young adults
- Promote peer support and the social inclusion of families and youth

1.2 BACKGROUND

The Division is committed to improving the health and well-being of North Carolinians through an innovative, whole person centered and well-coordinated system that addresses medical and non-medical drivers of health. The NC SOC approach is the framework through which the Division will deliver Medicaid and State-funded behavioral health services and developmental and/or intellectual disability services for children 3-18 years of age.

The core elements of this framework include the following:

- Family and youth-guided services
- Cross-system collaboration
- Service coordination within and across various child-serving systems
- The use of individualized, strength-based, trauma-informed/resilience-oriented approach
- Culturally and linguistically competent care
- Evidence-based or informed services provided in a home or community setting
- Family and youth involvement in regional and state policy development, service implementation and evaluation

The key components of NC's SOC infrastructure includes:

- Community Collaboratives
- SOC Coordinators
- Multiple Family Support and Advocacy individuals across the state
- The NC Collaborative for Children, Youth, and Families (State Collaborative)

DMH/DD/SAS aims to identify and partner with an organization that embodies the SOC approach administratively, operationally, and financially. This partnership will extend into many projects and/or initiatives that the Child Mental Health Team are engaged in terms of providing consultation and technical expertise and training.

A Statewide Family and Youth Advocacy and Support Organization is a family-run or controlled entity with the philosophical, administrative, financial and SOC-based experience that coordinate the existing family support and advocacy individuals into a network of well-trained, informed, and experienced staff who are integral to both State and Local Systems of Care development. Such an organization ensures and provides the following:

- Support to state agencies and local communities in meeting and upholding SOC values and practices
- Statewide family peer support, education, and training of caregivers and providers
- Statewide family partner competency
- Consultation on service implementation to a variety of public and private agencies who submit requests
- Quality assurance across communities
- Leadership network around the state to reinforce local SOC development

2.0 ELIGIBILITY

Eligible applicants are non-profit organizations and:

- a. Have a board of directors composed of more than 50 percent of family members who have or have had the primary daily responsibility for the raising of a child, youth, or young adult with Serious Emotional Disturbance for at least 12 months
- b. Have adequate financial stability to ensure a minimum of 3 months of funds to cover organization expenses without Division funding
- c. Have statewide coverage OR a plan to expand to statewide coverage within the next 2 years

5.1 PROGRAMMATIC REQUIREMENTS AND PRIORITIES

An award based upon successful application for these funds is intended to allow a Family and Youth Advocacy and Support Organization committed to supporting and advocating for families of youth, youth, and young adults with behavioral health needs and to do the following:

- a. Hire, train, and support Family & Youth Support/Advocacy individuals
 - Hire, assign catchment area and supervise Family Partner Coordinators and 1 Youth Support Partner
- b. Develop and sustain a training and credentialing curriculum for Family Support Partners, Family Navigators, and Family Partner Coordinators
- c. Develop and sustain a training and credentialing curriculum for Youth Partners and Youth Partner Coordinators
- d. Partner with local and State Collaboratives

- e. Promote and advocate for Family Voice and Choice at all levels of services, systems, and policies
- f. Link families to partners across the State to address needs identified by the children, youth, and the families that they serve
- g. Foster leadership skills among families of children and youth
- h. Work effectively with policy makers and service
- i. Promote peer support and social inclusion of families of youth.
- j. In partnership with local family organizations, provide workshops addressing the mental health needs of children and youth with serious emotional disturbance (SED).
- k. Support the development of parent/family support providers, including training and credentialing. NOTE: Applicants should describe the type of peer training (formal/informal) to be offered; the type of training certification peers will possess; the peer supervision structure; and the manner in which peer support services will be evaluated and measured. Trainings and certifications are to be developed by the organization selected for the RFA – they are the subject matter experts, and the expectation is that trainings and certifications will be in line with national certification and training standards
- I. Attend and participate in local, state, and/or national meetings and conferences to provide information, provide input and gather feedback on service and system planning

 - Services financing
 - Respite care
 - Sustainability
 - Leadership development
 - Recovery programming
- o. Create, maintain, and support a 1-800 number for family members to obtain information and support
- p. Collaborate with state networks representing adult and youth mental health consumers
- q. Work with State agencies to encourage screening and early identification of children and youth with SED in various child-serving systems
- r. Support Department of Instruction, public school units and local Collaboratives/Regional Networks in developing school-based mental health services
- s. Work with state organizations of physicians and medical providers to encourage screening and early identification of children and youth with SED in primary care settings
- t. Promote SOC values and practices by developing and implementing youth, family, and agency partnership training around the state to cross-systems and sectors groups
- u. Establish and maintain formal relationships with SAMHSA-sponsored national agencies who have a similar mission at the national level
- v. Submit monthly tracking reports which include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - Number of family/youth representatives trained
 - Number of family/youth representatives recruited to the network
 - Number of family/youth representatives credentialing
 - Number of trainings provided
 - Number of partnerships developed
 - Number of outreach activities
- w. Submit lists of family/youth representatives and agencies (with contact information) on a semi-annual basis, denoting those recruited in the past six months.

5.2 CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITIES

5.3 PERFORMANCE STANDARDS AND EXPECTATIONS

The selected organization is expected to:

- a. Adhere to all contractual requirements as stipulated within the contract and identified deliverables. NC DMH/DD/SAS reserves the right to terminate a contact with or without cause
- b. Ensure all reports and tracking are completed within the time frames stipulated
- c. Develop state-approved metrics to measure the effectiveness and impact of services, supports, training, and activities conducted and will report to the State on those measures
- d. Ensure all employees have individual development plans that are:
 - a. Developed with the employee
 - b. Driven by employee-identified goals and needs
 - c. Reviewed on a consistent basis (at least quarterly)
 - d. Utilized to promote skill acquisition and self-efficacy

6.0 DIVISION RESPONSIBILITIES

NC DMHDDSAS reserves the right to:

- a. Modify the application and budget after consulting with the applicant. Items that may be modified include, but are not limited to, goals, costs, performance, and reporting requirements
- b. Allow or disallow budget amendments during the performance period of the project
- c. Monitor the program based on the Division's Subrecipient Monitoring plan
- d. Implement any change or requirement mandated by State or Federal government during the life of the project.

6.1 **PERFORMANCE OVERSIGHT**

A contract administrator will be assigned to the selected organization. This administrator will have programmatic and administrative oversight of the following:

- a. Performance measures
- b. Contract renewal, amendment, realignment
- c. Financial records: payments and invoices
- d. Training curriculum: development and calendar
- e. Performance metrics

7.0 TERM OF CONTRACT, OPTIONS TO EXTEND

A contract awarded pursuant to this RFA shall have an initial term of one (1) year, unless terminated earlier. The State retains the option to extend the Agreement for an additional two (2) one-year periods at its sole discretion.

8.0 <u>BUDGET</u>

The RFA/ line item budget shall constitute the total cost to the Division for complete performance in accordance with the requirements and specifications herein, including all applicable expenses such as administrative cost. Contractor shall not invoice for any amounts not specifically allowed for in the line item budget of this RFA.

The Contractor shall use the Cost Table found in ATTACHMENT A: Line Item Budget to create the Line Item Budget and Budget Narrative. The Vendor shall not use any other tables or forms, nor modify the contents of any of the shaded cells in the Cost Table.

All costs provided in Line Item budget must be firm and fixed for the duration of the contract, which could last as long as three years.

9.0 INVOICING AND REIMBURSEMENT

Upon execution of this contract, the Contractor shall submit to the Division Contract Administrator, a monthly reimbursement request for services rendered the previous month by the 10th of each month and, upon approval by the Division, receive payment within 30 days. Monthly payment shall be made based on actual expenditures made in accordance with the approved budget on file with both parties and reported on the monthly expenditure report submitted by the Contractor. If this contract is terminated, the Contractor shall complete a final accounting report and return any unearned funds to the Division within 30 days of the contract termination date. The Division shall have no obligation for payments based on expenditure reports submitted later than 30 days after termination or expiration of the contract period. All payments are contingent upon fund availability.

10.0 THE SOLICITATION PROCESS

The following is a general description of the process by which agencies or organizations will be selected to complete the goal or objective.

- 1) Written questions concerning the RFA specifications will be received until the date specified on the cover sheet of this RFA. A summary of all questions and answers will be posted on the RFA web site.
- 2) Applications will be received from each agency or organization. The original must be signed and dated by an official authorized to bind the agency or organization.
- 3) All applications must be received by the funding agency no later than the date and time specified on the cover sheet of the RFA. Faxed applications will not be accepted.
- 4) Upon receipt of an application, the responding agency and organization will be logged in.
- 5) At their option, the evaluators may request additional information from any or all Contractors for the purpose of clarification or to amplify the materials presented in any part of the application. However, agencies and organizations are cautioned that the evaluators are not required to request clarification: therefore, all applications should be complete and reflect the most favorable terms available from the agency or organization.
- 6) Applications will be evaluated according to completeness, content, experience with similar projects, ability of the agency's or organization's staff, cost, etc. The award of a grant to one agency and organization does not mean that the other applications lacked merit, but that, all facts considered, the selected application was deemed to provide the best service to the State.
- 7) Agencies and organizations are cautioned that this is a request for applications, and the funding agency reserves the unqualified right to reject any and all applications when such rejections are deemed to be in the best interest of the funding agency.
- 8) DMH/DD/SAS's review panel will conduct interviews with the top two (2) applicants prior to making a final selection.

11.0 GENERAL INFORMATION ON SUBMITTING APPLICATIONS

1) Award or Rejection

All qualified applications will be evaluated, and awards made to those agencies or organizations whose capabilities are deemed to be in the best interest of the funding agency. The funding agency reserves the unqualified right to reject any or all offers if determined to be in its best interest.

2) <u>Decline to Offer</u>

Any agency or organization that receives a copy of the RFA but declines to make an offer is requested to send a written "Decline to Offer" to the funding agency. Failure to respond as requested may subject the agency or organization to removal from consideration of future RFAs.

- <u>Cost of Application Preparation</u> Any cost incurred by an agency or organization in preparing or submitting an application is the agency's or organization's sole responsibility; the funding agency will not reimburse any agency or organization for any pre-award costs incurred.
- Elaborate Applications
 Elaborate applications in the form of brochures or other presentations beyond that necessary to present a complete and effective application are not desired.
- <u>Oral Explanations</u>
 The funding agency will not be bound by oral explanations or instructions given at any time during the competitive process or after awarding the grant.
- 6) <u>Reference to Other Data</u>
 Only information that is received in response to this RFA will be evaluated; reference to information previously submitted will not suffice.
 7) <u>Titles</u>
 - Titles and headings in this RFA and any subsequent RFA are for convenience only and shall have no binding force or effect.
- 8) Form of Application

Each application must be submitted on the form provided by the funding agency, which will become the funding agency's Performance Agreement (contract).

9) Exceptions

All applications are subject to the terms and conditions outlined herein. All responses will be

controlled by such terms and conditions. The attachment of other terms and condition by any agency and organization may be grounds for rejection of that agency or organization's application. Funded agencies and organizations specifically agree to the conditions set forth in the Performance Agreement (contract).

10) Advertising

In submitting its application, agencies and organizations agree not to use the results therefrom or as part of any news release or commercial advertising without prior written approval of the funding agency.

11) Right to Submitted Material

All responses, inquiries, or correspondence relating to or in reference to the RFA, and all other reports, charts, displays, schedules, exhibits, and other documentation submitted by the agency or organization will become the property of the funding agency when received.

12) Competitive Offer

Pursuant to the provision of G.S. 143-54, and under penalty of perjury, the signer of any application submitted in response to this RFA thereby certifies that this application has not been arrived at collusively or otherwise in violation of either Federal or North Carolina antitrust laws.

13) Agency and Organization's Representative

Each agency or organization shall submit with its application the name, address, and telephone number of the person(s) with authority to bind the agency or organization and answer questions or provide clarification concerning the application.

14) Subcontracting

Agencies and organizations may propose to subcontract portions of work provided that their applications clearly indicate the scope of the work to be subcontracted, and to whom. All information required about the prime grantee is also required for each proposed subcontractor.

15) Proprietary Information

Trade secrets or similar proprietary data which the agency or organization does not wish disclosed to other than personnel involved in the evaluation will be kept confidential to the extent permitted by NCAC TO1: 05B.1501 and G.S. 132-1.3 if identified as follows: Each page shall be identified in boldface at the top and bottom as "CONFIDENTIAL." Any section of the application that is to remain confidential shall also be so marked in boldface on the title page of that section.

16) Participation Encouraged

Pursuant to Article 3 and 3C, Chapter 143 of the North Carolina General Statutes and Executive Order No. 77, the funding agency invites and encourages participation in this RFA by businesses owned by minorities, women and the disabled including utilization as subcontractor(s) to perform functions under this Request for Applications.

17) Contract

The Division will issue a contract to the recipient of the grant that will include their application. 18) Federal Certifications

 Agencies or organizations receiving Federal funds will be required to execute Federal Certifications regarding Non-discrimination, Drug-Free Workplace, Environmental Tobacco Smoke, Debarment, Lobbying, and Lobbying Activities. A copy of the Federal Certifications is included in this RFA for your reference (see Appendix B). Federal Certifications should NOT be signed or returned with the application.

Please be advised that successful Contractors may be required to have an audit in accordance with G. S. 143-6.2 as applicable to the agency or organization's status. Also, the contract may include assurances the successful Contractor would be required to execute when signing the contract. Agencies or organizations receiving Federal funds will be required to execute a Consolidated Federal Certification form (as applicable). Private not for profit agency contracts will also include a conflict-of-interest policy statement.

12.0 APPLICATION CONTENT AND INSTRUCTIONS

The Applicant must clearly demonstrate (describe) in its proposal response how the Contractor's organization will meet or address the programmatic requirements described in the scope of work section of the RFA. The Contractor proposal shall include the following items in this specific order and clearly marked as such.

In many cases, the summary will be the first part of the proposal package seen by the agency and could potentially be the only part of the package that is carefully reviewed before the decision is made to consider the project any further.

D. Organization Background and Qualifications: Describes the organization and its qualifications for funding (15 points)

 - Whether any of the contracts were renewed or extended
 - Whether any contracts were terminated early for cause by either party
 - "Lessons learned" from those contracts
 - The name, address, and telephone number of at least one contractor who is familiar with the applicant's performance in the contract
- e. Number of family and youth staff
 - Include how many with lived experience
- f. How has your organization supported children, youth, and young adults with behavioral health needs (and their families) in your catchment area or at the State level?
- g. Describe your organization's cross-system partnership and agency with at least two (2) different child-serving systems
 - What did each activity accomplish for your organization's population of focus?
 - What did your organization learn from each of the experiences?
- h. Describe your current network of family support/youth support individuals (including number, geographic distribution, demographics)

- i. Describe your organization's efforts to monitor your training and technical assistance system and how you ensure fidelity to the NC SOC Child and Family Team training standards
- j. Describe your organization's capacity to track:
 - Data bases on staff activity
 - Family and youth outcomes
 - Impact on policy/programming
 - Training and technical assistance activities
- k. Provide a summary of other family support and advocacy organizations (they do not have to be family-controlled agencies) that your organization has informal and/or formal relationships with
 - Describe the partnership
 - Describe the goals/objectives
 - Length of partnership
- I. Provide a summary of existing relationships with LME-MCOs
 - Extent of the relationship
 - Has your organization introduced itself to Prepaid Health Plans or been approached by a Prepaid Health Plan in NC? If so, please describe.
- m. Is your organization familiar with SOC values and principles?
 - Which values of your organization relate to those values?

Relationships of the Parties

Independent Contractor: The Contractor is and shall be deemed to be an independent contractor in the performance of this contract and as such shall be wholly responsible for the work to be performed and for the supervision of its employees. The Contractor represents that it has, or shall secure at its own expense, all personnel required in performing the services under this agreement. Such employees shall not be employees of, or have any individual contractual relationship with, the Division.

Subcontracting: The Contractor shall not subcontract any of the work contemplated under this contract without prior written approval from the Division. Any approved subcontract shall be subject to all conditions of this contract. Only the subcontractors specified in the contract documents are to be considered approved upon award of the contract. The Division shall not be obligated to pay for any work performed by any unapproved subcontractor. The Contractor shall be responsible for the performance of all of its subcontractors.

Assignment: No assignment of the Contractor's obligations or the Contractor's right to receive payment hereunder shall be permitted. However, upon written request approved by the issuing purchasing authority, the State may: (a) Forward the Contractor's payment check directly to any person or entity designated by the Contractor, or (b) Include any person or entity designated by the Contractor as a joint payee on the Contractor's payment check. In no event shall such approval and action obligate the State to anyone other than the Contractor and the Contractor shall remain responsible for fulfillment of all contract obligations.

Beneficiaries: Except as herein specifically provided otherwise, this contract shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective successors. It is expressly understood and agreed that the enforcement of the terms and conditions of this contract, and all rights of action relating to such enforcement, shall be strictly reserved to the Division and the named Contractor. Nothing contained in this document shall give or allow any claim or right of action whatsoever by any other third person. It is the express intention of the Division and Contractor that any such person or entity, other than the Division or the Contractor, receiving services or benefits under this contract shall be deemed an incidental beneficiary only.

Services

Service Standards: During the term of the Agreement the Contractor and its employees, agents, and subcontractors shall provide high quality professional services consistent with the standards of practice in the geographic area and with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules and regulations, all applicable ethical standards, and standards established by applicable accrediting agencies. The Contractor and its employees, agents and subcontractors shall exercise independent professional judgment in the treatment and care of patients.

Records: During the term of this Agreement, the Contractor and its employees, agents, and subcontractors shall maintain complete and professionally adequate medical records consistent with the standards of practice in the geographic area and their respective health care professions. The Contractor and its employees, agents, and subcontractors shall prepare all reports, notes, forms, claims and correspondence that are necessary and appropriate to their professional services.

Licenses: During the term of this Agreement, the Contractor and its employees, agents, and subcontractors shall hold, current facility and occupational licenses and certifications at the levels required to practice their professions and to provide the contracted services in the State of North Carolina.

Indemnity and Insurance

Indemnification: The Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Division, the State of North Carolina, and any of their officers, agents and employees, from any claims of third parties arising out of any act or omission of the Contractor or its employees, agents, or subcontractors in connection with the performance of this contract.

- (a) Insurance: During the term of the contract, the Contractor shall provide, at its sole cost and expense, commercial insurance of such types and with such terms and limits as may be reasonably associated with the contract. At a minimum, the Contractor shall provide and maintain the following coverage and limits:
 - (1) **Professional Liability Insurance**: The Contractor shall ensure that the Contractor and its employees, agents, and subcontractors each maintain through an insurance company or through a program of self-funded insurance, professional liability insurance with limits of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence and at least \$3,000,000 in the aggregate.

- (2) Worker's Compensation Insurance: The Contractor shall provide and maintain worker's compensation insurance, as required by the laws of the states in which its employees work, covering all of the Contractor's employees who are engaged in any work under the contract.
- (3) **Employer's Liability Insurance:** The Contractor shall provide employer's liability insurance, with minimum limits of \$500,000.00, covering all of the Contractor's employees who are engaged in any work under the contract.
- (4) **Commercial General Liability Insurance**: The Contractor shall provide commercial general liability insurance on a comprehensive broad form on an occurrence basis with a minimum combined single limit of \$1,000,000.00 for each occurrence.
- (5) Automobile Liability Insurance: The Contractor shall provide automobile liability insurance with a combined single limit of \$500,000.00 for bodily injury and property damage; a limit of \$500,000.00 for uninsured/under insured motorist coverage; and a limit of \$2,000.00 for medical payment coverage.  - (A) owned by the Contractor and used in the performance of this contract;
 - (B) hired by the Contractor and used in the performance of this contract; and
 - (C) owned by Contractor's employees and used in performance of this contract ("non-owned vehicle insurance"). Nonowned vehicle insurance protects employers when employees use their personal vehicles for work purposes. Non-owned vehicle insurance supplements, but does not replace, the car-owner's liability insurance.

The Contractor is not required to provide and maintain automobile liability insurance on any vehicle – owned, hired, or non-owned -- unless the vehicle is used in the performance of this contract.

The Division shall be the sole judge of whether such a waiver should be granted.
- (f) Providing and maintaining the types and amounts of insurance or self-insurance specified in this paragraph is a material obligation of the Contractor and is of the essence of this contract.
- (g) The Contractor shall only obtain insurance from companies that are authorized to provide such coverage and that are authorized by the Commissioner of Insurance to do business in the State of North Carolina. All such insurance shall meet all laws of the State of North Carolina.

Default and Termination

Termination Without Cause: The Division may terminate this contract without cause by giving **30 days written notice** to the Contractor. In that event, all finished or unfinished deliverable items prepared by the Contractor under this contract shall, at the option of the Division, become its property and the Contractor shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any satisfactory work completed on such materials, minus any payment or compensation previously made.

Termination for Cause: If, through any cause, the Contractor shall fail to fulfill its obligations under this contract in a timely and proper manner, the Division shall have the right to terminate this contract by giving written notice to the Contractor and specifying the effective date thereof. In that event, all finished or unfinished deliverable items prepared by the Contractor under this contract shall, at the option of the Division, become its property and the Contractor shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any satisfactory work completed on such materials, minus any payment or compensation previously made. Notwithstanding the foregoing provision, the Contractor shall not be relieved of liability to the Division for damages sustained by the Division by virtue of the Contractor's breach of this agreement, and the Division may withhold any payment due the Contractor for the purpose of setoff until such time as the exact amount of damages due the Division from such breach can be determined. Force Majeure: Neither party shall be deemed to be in default of its obligations hereunder if and so long as it is prevented from performing such obligations by any act of war, hostile foreign action, nuclear explosion, riot, strikes, civil insurrection, earthquake, hurricane, tornado, or other catastrophic natural event or act of God.

Survival of Promises: All promises, requirements, terms, conditions, provisions, representations, guarantees, and warranties contained herein shall survive the contract expiration or termination date unless specifically provided otherwise herein, or unless superseded by applicable Federal or State statutes of limitation.

Compliance with Applicable Laws

Compliance with Laws: The Contractor shall comply with all laws, ordinances, codes, rules, regulations, and licensing requirements that are applicable to the conduct of its business, including those of federal, state, and local agencies having jurisdiction and/or authority.

Equal Employment Opportunity: The Contractor shall comply with all federal and State laws relating to equal employment opportunity.

Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA): The Contractor agrees that, if the Division determines that some or all of the activities within the scope of this contract are subject to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, P.L. 104-91, as amended ("HIPAA"), or its implementing regulations, it will comply with the HIPAA requirements and will execute such agreements and practices as the Division may require to ensure compliance.

Confidentiality

Confidentiality: Any information, data, instruments, documents, studies or reports given to or prepared or assembled by the Contractor under this agreement shall be kept as confidential and not divulged or made available to any individual or organization without the prior written approval of the Division. The parties specifically agree that all medical and other patient records shall be treated as confidential so as to comply with all state and federal laws and regulations regarding confidentiality of such records. These confidentiality obligations shall not terminate with the termination of this Agreement.

Data Security: The Contractor shall adopt and apply data security standards and procedures that comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and rules.

Duty to Report: The Contractor shall report a suspected or confirmed security breach to the Division's Contract Administrator within twenty-four (24) hours after the breach is first discovered, provided that the Contractor shall report a breach involving Social Security Administration data or Internal Revenue Service data within one (1) hour after the breach is first discovered. During the performance of this contract, the contractor is to notify the Division contract administrator of any contact by the federal Office for Civil Rights (OCR) received by the contractor.

The place of this contract and all transactions and agreements relating to it, and their situs and forum, shall be Wake County, North Carolina, where all matters, whether sounding in contract or tort, relating to the validity, construction, interpretation, and enforcement shall be determined.

Amendment: This contract may not be amended orally or by performance. Any amendment must be made in written form and executed by duly authorized representatives of the Division and the Contractor. The Purchase and Contract Divisions of the NC Department of Administration and the NC Department of Health and Human Services shall give prior approval to any amendment to a contract awarded through those offices.

Severability: In the event that a court of competent jurisdiction holds that a provision or requirement of this contract violates any applicable law, each such provision

responsible for any excess cost occasioned thereby. The filing of a petition for bankruptcy by the Contractor shall be an act of default under this contract.

Waiver of Default: Waiver by the Division of any default or breach in compliance with the terms of this contract by the Contractor shall not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent default or breach and shall not be construed to be modification of the terms of this contract unless stated to be such in writing, signed by an authorized representative of the Division and the Contractor and attached to the contract.

Availability of Funds: The parties to this contract agree and understand that the payment of the sums specified in this contract is dependent and contingent upon and subject to the appropriation, allocation, and availability of funds for this purpose to the Division.

Force Majeure: Neither party shall be deemed to be in default of its obligations hereunder if and so long as it is prevented from performing such obligations by any act of war, hostile foreign action, nuclear explosion, riot, strikes, civil insurrection, earthquake, hurricane, tornado, or other catastrophic natural event or act of God.

Survival of Promises: All promises, requirements, terms, conditions, provisions, representations, guarantees, and warranties contained herein shall survive the contract expiration or termination date unless specifically provided otherwise herein, or unless superseded by applicable Federal or State statutes of limitation.

Intellectual Property Rights

Copyrights and Ownership of Deliverables: All deliverable items produced pursuant to this contract are the exclusive property of the Division. The Contractor shall not assert a claim of copyright or other property interest in such deliverables.

Federal Intellectual Property Bankruptcy Protection Act: The Parties agree that the Division shall be entitled to all rights and benefits of the Federal Intellectual Property Bankruptcy Protection Act, Public Law 100-506, codified at 11 U.S.C. 365 (n) and any amendments thereto.

Compliance with Applicable Laws

The Purchase and Contract Divisions of the NC Department of Administration and the NC Department of Health and Human Services shall give prior approval to any amendment to a contract awarded through those offices.

The term "key personnel" includes any and all persons identified by as such in the contract documents and any other persons subsequently identified as key personnel by the written agreement of the parties.

Care of Property: The Contractor agrees that it shall be responsible for the proper custody and care of any property furnished to it for use in connection with the performance of this contract and will reimburse the Division for loss of, or damage to, such property. At the termination of this contract, the Contractor shall contact the Division for instructions as to the disposition of such property and shall comply with these instructions.

Travel Expenses: Reimbursement to the Contractor for travel mileage, meals, lodging and other travel expenses incurred in the performance of this contract shall not exceed the rates published in the applicable State rules. International travel shall not be reimbursed under this contract.

Amendment: This contract may not be amended orally or by performance. Any amendment must be made in written form and executed by duly authorized representatives of the Division and the Contractor. The Purchase and Contract Divisions of the NC Department of Administration and the NC Department of Health and Human Services shall give prior approval to any amendment to a contract awarded through those offices.

Severability: In the event that a court of competent jurisdiction holds that a provision or requirement of this contract violates any applicable law, each such provision or requirement shall continue to be enforced to the extent it is not in violation of law or is not otherwise unenforceable and all other provisions and requirements of this contract shall remain in full force and effect.

Headings: The Section and Paragraph headings in these General Terms and Conditions are not material parts of the agreement and should not be used to construe the meaning thereof.

Gender and Number: Masculine pronouns shall be read to include feminine pronouns and the singular of any word or phrase shall be read to include the plural and vice versa.

Time of the Essence: Time is of the essence in the performance of this contract.

Key Personnel: The Contractor shall not replace any of the key personnel assigned to the performance of this contract without the prior written approval of the Division. The term "key personnel" includes any and all persons identified by as such in the contract documents and any other persons subsequently identified as key personnel by the written agreement of the parties. **Care of Property:** The Contractor agrees that it shall be responsible for the proper custody and care of any property furnished to it for use in connection with the performance of this contract and will reimburse the Division for loss of, or damage to, such property. At the termination of this contract, the Contractor shall contact the Division for instructions as to the disposition of such property and shall comply with these instructions.

Travel Expenses: Reimbursement to the Contractor for travel mileage, meals, lodging and other travel expenses incurred in the performance of this contract shall not exceed the rates published in the applicable State rules.

International travel shall not be reimbursed under this contract.

Sales/Use Tax Refunds: If eligible, the Contractor and all subcontractors shall: (a) ask the North Carolina Department of Revenue for a refund of all sales and use taxes paid by them in the performance of this contract, pursuant to G.S. 105-164.14; and (b) exclude all refundable sales and use taxes from all reportable expenditures before the expenses are entered in their reimbursement reports.

Relationships of the Parties

Independent Contractor: The Contractor is and shall be deemed to be an independent contractor in the performance of this contract and as such shall be wholly responsible for the work to be performed and for the supervision of its employees. The Contractor represents that it has, or shall secure at its own expense, all personnel required in performing the services under this agreement. Such employees shall not be employees of, or have any individual contractual relationship with, the Division.

Subcontracting: The Contractor shall not subcontract any of the work contemplated under this contract without prior written approval from the Division. Any approved subcontract shall be subject to all conditions of this contract. Only the subcontractors specified in the contract documents are to be considered approved upon award of the contract. The Division shall not be obligated to pay for any work performed by any unapproved subcontractor. The Contractor shall be responsible for the performance of all of its subcontractors.

Assignment: No assignment of the Contractor's obligations or the Contractor's right to receive payment hereunder shall be permitted. However, upon written request approved by the issuing purchasing authority, the State may: (a) Forward the Contractor's payment check(s) directly to any person or entity designated by the Contractor, or (b) Include any person or entity designated by Contractor as a joint payee on the Contractor's payment check(s). In no event shall such approval and action obligate the State to anyone other than the Contractor and the Contractor shall remain responsible for fulfillment of all contract obligations.

Beneficiaries: Except as herein specifically provided otherwise, this contract shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective successors. It is expressly understood and agreed that the enforcement of the terms and conditions of this contract, and all rights of action relating to such enforcement, shall be strictly reserved to the Division and the named Contractor. Nothing contained in this document shall give or allow any claim or right of action whatsoever by any other third person. It is the express intention of the Division and Contractor that any such person or entity, other than the Division or the Contractor, receiving services or benefits under this contract shall be deemed an incidental beneficiary only.

Services

Service Standards: The Contractor shall provide high quality services consistent with the standard of practice in the geographic area and with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules and regulations, all applicable ethical standards, and standards established by applicable accrediting agencies. Notwithstanding the previously foregoing provision, the Contractor shall not be relieved of liability to the Division for damages sustained by the Division by virtue of the Contractor's breach of this agreement, and the Division may withhold any payment due the Contractor for the purpose of setoff until such time as the exact amount of damages due the Division from such breach can be determined. In case of default by the Contractor, without limiting any other remedies for breach available to it, the Division may procure the contract services from other sources and hold the Contractor

responsible for any excess cost occasioned thereby. The filing of a petition for bankruptcy by the Contractor shall be an act of default under this contract.

Waiver of Default: Waiver by the Division of any default or breach in compliance with the terms of this contract by the Contractor shall not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent default or breach and shall not be construed to be modification of the terms of this contract unless stated to be such in writing, signed by an authorized representative of the Division and the Contractor and attached to the contract.

Availability of Funds: The parties to this contract agree and understand that the payment of the sums specified in this contract is dependent and contingent upon and subject to the appropriation, allocation, and availability of funds for this purpose to the Division.

Force Majeure: Neither party shall be deemed to be in default of its obligations hereunder if and so long as it is prevented from performing such obligations by any act of war, hostile foreign action, nuclear explosion, riot, strikes, civil insurrection, earthquake, hurricane, tornado, or other catastrophic natural event or act of God.

Survival of Promises: All promises, requirements, terms, conditions, provisions, representations, guarantees, and warranties contained herein shall survive the contract expiration or termination date unless specifically provided otherwise herein, or unless superseded by applicable Federal or State statutes of limitation.

Patents And Inventions: Any invention or discovery made or conceived in the performance of this contract (hereinafter called "*INVENTION*"), and any patent granted on such *INVENTION* shall be jointly or individually owned by Contractor and/or Division in accordance with the following criteria:

- (a)Title to any *INVENTION* made or conceived jointly by employees of both Contractor and Division in the performance of this contract (hereinafter called "*JOINT INVENTION*") vests jointly in Division and Contractor.

Conflict of Interest Policy Example

The Board of Directors/Trustees or other governing persons, officers, employees or agents are to avoid any conflict of interest, even the appearance of a conflict of interest. The Organization's Board of Directors/Trustees or other governing body, officers, staff and agents are obligated to always act in the best interest of the organization. This obligation requires that any Board member or other governing person, officer, employee or agent, in the performance of Organization duties, seek only the furtherance of the Organization mission. At all times, Board members or other governing persons, officers, employees or agents, are prohibited from using their job title, the Organization's name or property, for private profit or benefit.

A. The Board members or other governing persons, officers, employees, or agents of the Organization should neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, or anything of monetary value from current or potential contractors/vendors, persons receiving benefits from the Organization or persons who may benefit from the actions of any Board member or other governing person, officer, employee or agent. This is not intended to preclude bona-fide Organization fund raising-activities.

B. A Board or other governing body member may, with the approval of Board or other governing body, receive honoraria for lectures and other such activities while not acting in any official capacity for the Organization. Officers may, with the approval of the Board or other governing body, receive honoraria for lectures and other such activities while on personal days, compensatory time, annual leave, or leave without pay. Employees may, with the prior written approval of their supervisor, receive honoraria for lectures and other such activities while on personal days, compensatory time, annual leave, or leave without pay. Employees may, with the prior written approval of their supervisor, receive honoraria for lectures and other such activities while on personal days, compensatory time, annual leave, or leave without pay. If a Board or other governing body member, officer, employee or agent is acting in any official capacity, honoraria received in connection with activities relating to the Organization are to be paid to the Organization.

C. No Board member or other governing person, officer, employee, or agent of the Organization shall participate in the selection, award, or administration of a purchase or contract with a vendor where, to his knowledge, any of the following has a financial interest in that purchase or contract:
The Board member or other governing person, officer, employee, or agent;
Any member of their family by whole or half blood, step or personal relationship or relative-in-law;
An organization in which any of the above is an officer, director, or employee;
A person or organization with whom any of the above individuals is negotiating or has any arrangement concerning prospective employment or contracts.

D. Duty to Disclosure -- Any conflict of interest, potential conflict of interest, or the appearance of a conflict of interest is to be reported to the Board or other governing body or one's supervisor immediately.

E. Board Action -- When a conflict of interest is relevant to a matter requiring action by the Board of Directors/Trustees or other governing body, the Board member or other governing person, officer, employee, or agent (person(s)) must disclose the existence of the conflict of interest and be given the opportunity to disclose all material facts to the Board and members of committees with governing board delegated powers considering the possible conflict of interest. After disclosure of all material facts, and after any discussion with the person, he/she shall leave the governing board or committee meeting while the determination of a conflict of interest is discussed and voted upon. The remaining board or committee members shall decide if a conflict of interest exists.

In addition, the person(s) shall not participate in the final deliberation or decision regarding the matter under consideration and shall leave the meeting during the discussion of and vote of the Board of Directors/Trustees or other governing body.

F. Violations of the Conflicts of Interest Policy -- If the Board of Directors/Trustees or other governing body has reasonable cause to believe a member, officer, employee or agent has failed to disclose actual or possible conflicts of interest, it shall inform the person of the basis for such belief and afford the person an opportunity to explain the alleged failure to disclose. If, after hearing the person's response and after making further investigation as warranted by the circumstances, the Board of Directors/Trustees or other governing body determines the member, officer, employee or agent has failed to disclose an actual or possible conflict of interest, it shall take appropriate disciplinary and corrective action.

G. Record of Conflict -- The minutes of the governing board and all committees with board delegated powers shall contain:

The names of the persons who disclosed or otherwise were found to have an actual or possible conflict of interest, the nature of the conflict of interest, any action taken to determine whether a conflict of interest was present, and the governing board's or committee's decision as to whether a conflict of interest in fact existed.
