








Transgenerational Trauma

Transgenerational trauma (also called intergenerational trauma) is defined as trauma that gets passed down from those who directly experience an incident to subsequent generations. It can be caused by several factors, that include:

- Personal trauma
- Trauma experienced by a cultural, racial, or ethnic group
- Major historical event



Transgenerational Trauma

Transgenerational trauma does not have to be because of a direct trauma, it can result from systemic oppression. These experiences can illicit a trauma response in individuals who experience these events. Systemic oppression can include:

- Racial discrimination
- Economic disparities
- Lack of access to education, healthcare, and other resources
- Social stereotypes

Historical Trauma

Historical trauma is a concept that describes psychological and emotional wounds experienced by marginalized groups of people due to major oppressive events that include:

- Slavery
- The Holocaust
- The Great Depression
- Colonization
- Stonewall Riots



Historical Trauma

Africans and African Americans were used for domestic labor in the United States against their will. The term, separate but equal, was used but many things were less than equal.	The significant increase in the use of <u>crack cocaine</u> , or crack, in the <u>United</u> <u>States</u> during the early 1980s. 


The Green Book


- The Green Book had several editions
- Provided African American travelers information on safe places to use while traveling, especially in sundown towns.

Historical sundown towns focused mainly in midwest

The History and Social Justice website, hosted by Tougaloo College, maintains a database of user-submitted entries of historical sundown towns in the U.S. The entries for the sundown towns range from an "unlikely" sundown town to "surely." The count also includes sundown counties.


Interpersonal Racism

Interpersonal racism (e.g., microaggressions, discrimination)

- ❖ Interpersonal Racism is racism that occurs between individuals.
 - Microaggressions are actions that negatively target a marginalized group or individual. A microaggression is a form of discrimination that can be intentional or accidental.
 - Discrimination is the unfair or prejudicial treatment of people and groups based on characteristics such as race gender, age, or sexual orientation.

Microaggressions fall into three categories: Micro assaults, Microinsults, and Microinvalidations




Structural Racism

- Structural racism (e.g., systemic oppression, institutionalized discrimination "systemic racism")
 - Structural racism and discrimination (SRD) refers to macro-level conditions (e.g. residential segregation and institutional policies) that limit opportunities, resources, power, and well-being of individuals and populations based on race/ethnicity and other statuses

Systemic Oppression Cycle

CROWN ACT [law which prohibits discrimination based on hair texture or style]

Psychological Mechanism

- The attachment bond developed during childhood between the child and caregiver is considered a "lasting psychological connection."
 - A secure attachment is developed when a caregiver is consistent in meeting the child's emotional and physical needs.
 - An insecure attachment style is developed when these needs are not consistently met.





Psychological Mechanism


- Studies have shown a connection between intergenerational family narratives sharing and psychological wellbeing predominantly with younger generations.
- Narratives/Stories are important in every culture and religion and are influential in how the family interact with each other.
 - In African American communities, the use of storytelling provides a voice, means of carrying forth lessons, aspirations and to preserve events.

Biological Mechanism

- Epigenetics is an evolving area of research on how high levels of stress (environmental influences) can change how easily gens can be turned on or off during development and throughout our lifespan.
 - New research has found that some epigenetic effects based on experiences can be transferred across generations.



Biological Mechanism

- An association was found between parental trauma with epigenetic modification and effects on the exposed parent and their offspring.
- Medical disadvantages that are environmentally induced requires access to good medical and psychiatric care to address profound disparities in health.

Thus, the epigenome can be affected by positive experiences, such as supportive relationships and opportunities for learning...




... or negative influences, such as environmental toxins or stressful life circumstances ...

The Tuskegee Study "Experiment"

- Conducted from 1932-1972
 - 399 of the 600 black men were diagnosed with syphilis
- 1972 Associated Press story was published noting the study was "ethically unjustified"
 74 of the 600 were living at experiment end
- 1997 public acknowledgement of the unethical treatment and apology

Healing Through Reparenting

- Write a letter to your inner child
- Hang up a few photos of yourself as a child, speak directly to your inner child
- Recognize the physical cues that your inner child is becoming activated and write them down
- Inner child affirmations and reminders from the inner parent



Healing through Reparenting

- Celebrate when you notice that you acted from your loving inner parent
- Build a consistent supportive community
- Practice reciprocal biculturalism
- Attachment and Biobehavioral Catchup (ABC) or other parenting coaching or family therapy


