

Mobile apps to aid Communication Access for Individuals who are Deaf, Hard of Hearing and DeafBlind

Personal Sound Amplification Apps [search: sound amplifier, sound amplification or amplification]

- Jacoti ListenApp (iOS)
- Sound Amplifier (<u>Android</u>) (<u>iOS</u>)
- Clear Sound by ZipoApps (iOS). Can be used on iPhone and iPad
- <u>Apple's Live Listen</u> works with Apple AirPods, made for iPhone headphones, and certain hearing aids or cochlear implants.

Personal sound amplifiers – which are different than personal amplification apps – are devices specifically designed for amplifying sound for people with hearing loss.

Speech-to-Text Apps [search: speech-to-text or voice to text]

- <u>Google Live Transcribe</u> (Android) (User can type response, many languages.)
- <u>Microsoft Translator</u> (This app allows user to use either type or speak in any language.) (<u>iOS, Android, Windows</u>)
- <u>Otter.ai</u> (iOS, Android) (Limitations: English only, free for 300 minutes, conversations limited to 30 minutes,)
- Big Note (iOS, Android) (Can use as speech-to-text or text-to-speech, large font sizes,)
- <u>Apple Live Captions Beta</u> (iOS) (Can use as speech-to-text,)

Typing Notes [search: note taking apps]

- Big Note (<u>iOS, Android</u>)
- Cardzilla (iOS, Android) (iOS has large font option,)
- Google Keep (iOS, Android)
- Sorenson Buzz Cards (iOS, Android)
- Notes (<u>iOS</u> only has large font option,)
- <u>Make it Big</u> (iOS) (Has large font option,)
