Did you know that dementia is not a normal part of the aging process?

Between 1999 & 2019, deaths in North Carolina from heart disease increased only 5% but during that same time deaths from Alzheimer's increased 145%.

Rates of dementia vary from state to state and among different races and ethnicities but African-Americans and Hispanics typically have higher rates of dementia than other races/ethnicities.



1 in 3 older adults in North Carolina dies with Alzheimer's Disease or a related dementia.
