BREASTFEEDING IN WIC

North Carolina WIC breastfeeding initiation rates increased by 44 percent between 1998 and 2022.

Among WIC infants who initiated breastfeeding in North Carolina in 2022, 29 percent continued breastfeeding at 6 months.



Fruit and Vegetable Benefit: Congress enhanced WIC's fruit and vegetable benefit to align with scientific recommendations. Current monthly benefit amounts are \$26 for children, \$47 for pregnant and postpartum participants, and \$52 for breastfeeding participants. In FY 2023, WIC provided an estimated \$75.5M in fruit and vegetable benefits to 203,392 participants in North Carolina.
