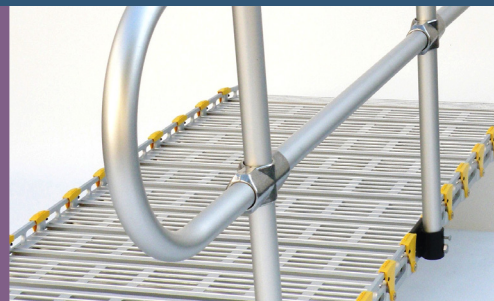




NC RAMMP: Access Makes Mobile People



The NC RAMMP Project, funded by the Christopher and Dana Reeve Foundation, loans **portable ramps to people with mobility difficulties**. If you are making the transition from a medical facility into your community or accessing a new location after an emergency, our short-term ramp loans can help you **overcome temporary obstacles to mobility** while we work with you to **plan long-term accessibility solutions**.

SOLUTIONS TO MAKE YOUR HOME ACCESSIBLE:

1 request a ramp

Contact NCATP to find out if a temporary, portable ramp is right for you. A RAMMP Project representative will discuss options and may visit your home to determine if a temporary, portable ramp can be safely installed.

2 demo a ramp

A RAMMP Project representative can demonstrate how the portable ramps are installed and may assist the user in the home set-up. These ramps are modular, made of aluminum, and weigh less than 100 pounds.

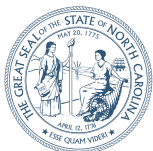
3 fund a ramp

Our ramps are designed for temporary use. If you need a more permanent solution for mobility issues, our staff can help identify resources to offset costs of a high-quality, permanent ramp.
