Welcome and Roll Call

Deb Goda, Olmstead Director, was not able to attend so Dr. Tamara Smith, Associate Director of Olmstead/Transitions to Community Living (TCL), started the meeting and welcomed all attendees. To maximize time for the agenda attendees were asked to enter their name and agency in the chat to confirm attendance.

Opening Remarks by Bryan Dooley, Co-Chair

Bryan provided opening remarks and Dr. Smith announced she was happy to have him join today and thrilled he's agreed to continue to serve as co-chair.

Money Follow the Person (MFP) - Presentation by Steve Strom, Project Director, Money Follows the Person Demonstration Project

Steve presented on MFP. Some key points were noted

- Helps people live in the most integrated setting.
- Highlighted an individual that lived in an Intermediate Care Facility (ICF) and now has a job
 in the community making more than minimum wage. He participates in weekly music
 classes and faith weekly meetings with the help of MFP.
- Emphasized the program is not set up to help individuals with mental health disabilities primarily.

PowerPoint of the presentation was distributed to attendees and anyone who missed the meeting.

Olmstead Quarterly Report and Next steps - Presentation by Rebecca Boss, Technical Assistance Collaborative (TAC).

Introduced a new format for the Olmstead quarterly report. Instead of focusing on six priority areas this time the report highlights two priority areas. Priority area #4 Increasing opportunities for preemployment transition services and competitive integrated employment opportunities and priority area #6 Promote the workforce development, recruitment, and retention.

She was diverted from being admitted into an adult care home (ACH) and is living successfully in the community. The TCL individual is finding her voice and presented as one of the guest speakers at TCL's annual In Reach Collaborative conference in the Spring of 2025.
