Mission of Vocational Rehabilitation (VR)

The Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services (DVRS) helps people with disabilities achieve their goals for employment and independence.



How Does VR Help Clients?

VR helps individuals with disabilities

- Prepare for work
- Find a job
- Return to work
- Keep a job
- Advance in employment

We focus on abilities and new possibilities

- Exploring interests, abilities and aptitudes
- Establishing an employment goal
- Planning and delivering the services and supports a client needs to achieve goal

Who is Eligible for VR Services?

Individuals age 14+ with a disability

Interested in pursuing employment

Disability-related barriers to successful employment

VR services required to reach an employment outcome

Social Security Beneficiary Eligibility



If you receive Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) or Supplemental Security Income (SSI), you are *presumed eligible* for VR services



You will receive information on SSI/SSDI Work Incentives available to you early in the VR planning process.



You can be referred to a benefits counselor to discuss how earned income can impact benefits and how to maximize SSA work incentives.

 - **VR** and client signatures

VR Transition Services for Students

VR Transition services help young people with disabilities explore and identify employment goals, develop an individualized plan of services that promote successful transition to competitive integrated employment, increased independence and community inclusion.

VR Services for Youth and Students

Pre-Employment Transition Services

VR pre-employment transition services (Pre-ETS) provide early access to career planning, work experience, and job readiness training to support the transition from high school to college, careers and adulthood.

- Student with a disability
- Ages 14 21
- Signed consent form

VR Transition Services

VR transition services empower young people with disabilities to further explore and pursue career interests, identify an employment goal, and overcome challenges they face along the way.

- Youth with a disability
- Ages 14 24
- Completed VR application and eligibility determination

VR Pre-Employment Transition Services for Students

Pre-ETS connect students with disabilities with shortterm opportunities to explore career pathways, develop in-demand skills and prepare for the future.



Independent Living Services

The Independent Living Rehabilitation Program – known as IL – connects eligible clients with services, resources and activities that lead to more independent living. Services may include:

- Rehabilitation Engineering
- Home and/or vehicle modifications
- Independent living skills training
- Assistive technology training and devices
- Personal Assistance services
- Assistance with leisure activities



VR collaborates with workforce system partners to prepare jobseekers with disabilities for careers with a future in NC.
